

# ICONIC LANDMARKS



## Monuments

*Bike, walk, or scooter your way around D.C.'s iconic monuments! Visit the National Mall for the Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, and others. Or head to Tidal Basin for the Jefferson Memorial and many more!*

## U.S. Capitol

*Schedule a tour of the U.S. Capitol on the Capitol Visitor's Center website or through your Representative or Senators' websites. The earlier the better!*



## Arlington National Cemetery

*Pay your respects at the Arlington National Cemetery. Visit the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and Military Women's Memorial. Download the ANC Explorer app before your visit for help finding tombstones and access to self-guided tours.*

# MUSEUMS

## Institutions

*See the founding documents of our nation at the National Archives including the Declaration of Independence & U.S. Constitution! Visit the Library of Congress and Supreme Court. Entrance fees are free but reservations may be required, see institution websites for more details.*



## Smithsonians

*There are 17 Smithsonians right here in D.C.! Come explore the American History, African American History, Asian Art, National Portrait Gallery, and more! Admission is always free, but some museums require reservations made on their websites.*

## Other Museums

*D.C. is full of many other museums! Check out the International Spy Museum, Ford's Theatre, Museum of the Bible, United States Holocaust Memorial Museum, and the Folger Shakespeare Library! Museums may charge for admission, check websites beforehand for tickets and reservations.*



# OUTDOORS



## Rock Creek Park

*Rock Creek Park was one of the first National Parks created! Explore by hiking, fishing, boating, biking, or packing a picnic! Learn about the park by joining a Ranger-led program or visiting the planetarium and nature center!*

## Out on the Water

*Love to be on the water? Kayak or paddleboard down the Potomac at Keystone Bridge or by the Wharf. For some history and monument sight seeing, take a boat tour of the city or rent a paddleboat at Tidal Basin!*



## Gardens

*If you're a plant lover, D.C. is the place for you! Check out the U.S. Botanical Gardens, National Arboretum, Kenilworth Park and Aquatic Gardens, or some of the many gardens outside of the Smithsonian on the National Mall for free! You can also visit the incredible gardens at Dumbarton Oaks or Hillwood Estate.*
