ABOUT THE NEW ENGLAND BOWL

The Eastern Collegiate Football Conference (ECFC), the Commonwealth Coast Conference (CCC), the Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference (MASCAC) and the New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) came together to present the Inaugural New England Bowl Game in 2016.

In 2017, the New England Bowl expanded to two games, featuring four teams, and in 2018, the series featured three games, including two teams from the CCC and NEWMAC and one from both the ECFC and MASCAC. This year's series highlights two games with a team from each of the four conferences represented.

From the group of teams declaring interest in participating, selection criteria includes overall record, conference record, conference standing, head-to-head results and results versus teams selected for the NCAA Division III Championship.

The four teams and two games for the 2023 New England Bowl Games were announced on November 12.

Salve Regina University (NEWMAC) will host Anna Maria College (ECFC) at Toppa Field at Freebody Park. The Seahawks last participated in the New England Bowl in 2018. This season marks the AMCATS' debut in the New England Bowl. Riding a three-game win streak, the Seahawks are 8-2 overall and 6-1 in conference play. The AMCATS have also won three-in-a-row with a 5-4 overall record (3-1 ECFC).

Western New England University (CCC) will host UMass Dartmouth (MASCAC) at Golden Bear Stadium. Both programs participated in New England Bowl Games in 2021 with WNE falling to Merchant Marine (63-35) and UMass Dartmouth defeating Alfred State (42-16). The Golden Bears are riding a four-game win streak. They posted a 7-3 overall record (4-1 CCC). The Corsairs are 9-1 overall and 7-1 in league play. UMass Dartmouth has won five-straight games.

CCC as a full member ahead of the 2025-26 season.

The Conference started operations as men's basketball league ahead of the 1984-85 season with seven teams competing that first year: Anna Maria College, Curry College, Emerson College, Hellenic College, Salve Regina University, the U.S. Coast Guard Academy and Wentworth Institute of Technology.

The Conference has sponsored football since 2017-18 when it assumed operations of the New England Football Conference (NEFC). The current football membership includes Curry, Endicott, Nichols, University of New England and Western New England with the addition of associate member Husson University. Maine Maritime Academy and New England College will join as associate members in football for the 2025 season.

Commissioner Patrick Colbert, Associate Commissioner JJ Archibald and Assistant Commissioner Molly O'Mara Fillmore comprise the CCC staff.

The Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference (MASCAC) is the nation's oldest Division III men's and women's playing conference and has a rich and storied tradition of competitive success while celebrating excellence in the classroom.

The MASCAC is comprised of eight State institutions: Bridgewater State University, Fitchburg State University, Framingham State University, Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts, Massachusetts Maritime Academy, Salem State University, Westfield State University and Worcester State University.

Two other institutions, the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth and Plymouth State University, are affiliate members of the conference in the sports of football and men's ice hockey, while Western Connecticut State University joined the conference as an affiliate member in football starting in 2013 while Springfield College became a men's golf affiliate in 2019.

Founded in 1970-71, at the urging of Trustee Howard Smith, the Athletic Directors of the State Colleges held a series of meetings to discuss the possibility of forming an Athletic Conference. In June of 1971, an affirmative agreement was reached and the Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference became a reality. In 2010 when the six colleges transitioned to universities the conference name was changed to the Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference.

The MASCAC mission statement is "The purpose of the Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference is to provide a comprehensive program of athletics for all State Universities. The objective underlying this purpose is to create a healthy atmosphere of competition and rivalry between the Universities and their student bodies while fostering the values of cooperation, leadership, courage, self-discipline, sportsmanship, diversity and self-reliance among the participating student-athletes."

ABOUT THE NEWMAC



The NEWMAC is an association of 12 selective academic institutions that are committed to providing high quality competitive athletic opportunities for student-athletes within an educational and respectful environment that embodies the NCAA Division III philosophy.

The NEWMAC was established in 1998, when the former New England Women's 8 Conference (NEW 8) voted to begin sponsoring conference play and championships for men. At this time, the conference expanded its membership to include Springfield College and the United States Coast Guard Academy. Emerson College became the 11th core member of the conference on July 1, 2013 and Salve Regina

University became the 12th core member on July 1, 2023.

The NEW 8 began play in 1985-86 as the New England Women's 6 Conference (NEW 6). Charter members were Babson College, Brandeis University, MIT, Smith College, Wellesley College and Wheaton College. Mount Holyoke College and WPI joined in 1988 and the name was changed to the NEW 8 Conference. At the conclusion of the 1994-95 academic year, Brandeis University withdrew from the NEW 8 and Clark University accepted membership, keeping the NEW 8's membership at eight institutions.

NEWMAC football institutions are U.S. Coast Guard Academy, MIT, U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, Norwich University, Salve Regina University, Springfield College, SUNY Maritime and WPI.

The conference office is run by Executive Director Patrick B. Summers, Associate Executive Director Taylor Teixeira, and Assistant Director for Strategic Communications Lindsay Colbert.
