Botox FAQs

Q: What are Botox injections?

A: Botox injections are injections of the cosmetic form of the botulinum toxin, which inhibits neuromuscular activity. Botox can be injected into areas of the face to improve the appearance of fine lines and wrinkles.

Q: How long do the results of Botox last?

A: The results of Botox are not permanent. For most patients, the results last three to four months though some patients may experience results lasting up to six months.
