The Wirehaired Vizsla is a medium size, energetic dog. They do best in an active family atmosphere. Their versatility has been shown not only in field and water as a hunting companion, but has excelled in agility, obedience, rally, lure coursing and any venue that they can use their nose.

The Wirehaired Vizsla Club of America has adopted a Code of Ethics to promote and foster the highest standards among breeders and owners; to encourage cooperation in the improvement, advancement and protection of our breed.

The Code of Ethics states that prior to mating, all breeding stock has been certified clear of hip dysplasia by the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (done after breeding stock is 2 years of age or older) and/or receive a Penn Hip score of .70 or better with no evidence of degenerative joint disease.

All breeding stock is to have a "normal" results from a yearly eye exam with either OFA-ERA or CERF certification.

The Wirehaired Vizsla Club of America also suggests testing for:

Elbow dysplasia
HUU-Hyperuricosuria
Cardiac disease

The Wirehaired Vizsla has been reported to be sensitive to vaccines and vaccine/flea medication combinations. Some Wirehaired Vizsla have had trouble coming out from under anesthetic.
