### **BOOST YOUR ATAR**

Successful completion of the two Accelerate units can contribute as a fifth or sixth subject in the calculation of your ATAR. You can achieve between 3 and 5 increment points, which will be added onto your ATAR aggregate.

### **STUDY ON CAMPUS OR ONLINE**

Attending a class on campus may not be convenient for you, or may not fit in with your VCE timetable - you can choose to **study either on campus, online or a blend of both**.

**Studying on campus** is a great way to immerse yourself in university life - you will *attend seminars and tutorials in person during the day with other first-year university students*.

If you choose to **study online**, your classes, seminars and assignments will be delivered to you via Deakin's Cloud Campus – the University's innovative and interactive learning environment. Not only will all your resources be instantly accessible, but you'll also communicate and collaborate with your academics and other students online in real time.

### **STUDY FOR FREE**

You won't have to pay any tuition fees as part of the Accelerate program. That means you'll complete two university units for free, so your future degree will cost you less. The only cost you may incur is if you need textbooks for your particular study area.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

The Accelerate program is for students who are:

- high-achievers with above-average Year 11 results
- self-starters who can work independently
- motivated to achieve a higher ATAR score
- keen to make a head-start on their university degree.

To be considered for the program, you'll need to submit your completed application by the application closing date. Your application must include:

- your Year 11 VASS statement - the school will provide this
- a recommendation from the school
- approval from the school principal
- permission from a parent or guardian
- a personal statement outlining your motivation to participate in the program.

## **SELECTION AND ENROLMENT**

Some study areas do have caps on the number of places available each year. These caps are defined by each faculty, however there are usually between 25 and 30 places available in each study area. To give you the best opportunity to be part of the program, you can select up to three study areas in order of preference. This means if you are not offered your first preference, you may be offered your second or third preference.

Applications are now open for the 2018 Deakin Accelerate program. To apply, you must download and complete the application pack before submitting your application online. Allow yourself enough time to complete a quality application, as there are a few steps and documents that need to be included.

Ensure you submit your application by *15 December 2017*.

All applications must be submitted online via the online application portal.

You will be notified of your place in the program after applications no later than 19 January 2018.

## Bachelor of Design (Architecture)

Commencing in 2018, Swinburne University will be introducing the 3-year **Bachelor of Design (Architecture)**. Students will *tackle digital technology, environmental awareness,*

construction, practice, ethics, history, and theory, as they visualise the innovative environments of tomorrow.

The VCE requirements are Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in English other than EAL.

Selection into this course will include the submission of an Online Digital Portfolio any time after 31 August 2017 at <https://architectureswin.slideroom.com/#/Login>. Applicants will need to submit up to eight pages, and respond to four design related questions, as it is understood that students enter architecture with many different skills and experiences.

### Studying Osteopathy at VU

***Osteopaths diagnose, treat and provide preventative advice about disorders that affect the body's musculoskeletal system, using manual techniques to alleviate stresses and dysfunction to improve the body's function ([Good Universities Guide - Osteopath](#))***

VU offers one of only three of these accredited double degree programs in Australia. Core studies include anatomy, osteopathic science, physiology and biochemistry. Students undertake fieldwork and clinical practice to prepare them for their osteopathy career.

Students considering a career in osteopathy need to complete the **Bachelor of Science (Osteopathy)** first; this is a 3-year course and provides an entry into an osteopathy career.

Completion of the Bachelor of Science (Osteopathy) course alone does not make graduates eligible for registration as Osteopaths. Students must also complete the Masters of Health Science (Osteopathy) in order to be eligible to register as an Osteopath. So, the double degree program is: [Bachelor of Science \(Osteopathy\)](#) - 3 years  
[Masters of Health Science \(Osteopathy\)](#) – 1,5 years

**On completion of both programs, students will be eligible for:**

- registration with the **Osteopaths Registration Board of Victoria**
- registration as an Osteopath in all other Australian states
- membership with the **Australian Osteopathic Association**

For further information about registration requirements, visit the [Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency](#) website. VU has a an [Osteopathy Teaching Clinic](#) which operates 47 weeks per year, and students are required to attend clinical sessions on a rotation basis including outside of semester hours to maintain a public service and provide continuity of patient care. Clinical training, including fieldwork, is crucial in the preparation to becoming an Osteopath. Students considering studying to become an Osteopath, might like to consider attending the upcoming

***Osteopathy Course Information Evening*** hosted by Victoria University. Attendees will have the opportunity to learn about how osteopathy is taught at VU, and participate in a tour of the facilities at the City Campus used by osteopathy students.
