The Audi A3 was introduced in Australia and New Zealand in May 2013. This ANCAP safety rating applies to all variants.

Dual frontal, side chest and side head airbags (curtains) and a driver knee airbag are standard. Antilock brakes (ABS), electronic brake distribution (EBD) and electronic stability control (ESC) are also standard. Advanced seat belt reminders are fitted to all seats.

In the frontal offset crash test driver chest protection was acceptable and passenger leg protection was acceptable. All other injury values were good in this test and in the side impact crash test. Head protection in the side pole test was good.

OCCUPANT PROTECTION

Frontal Offset Test.

Each body region is scored out of 4 points

Head / neck: 4.00 points
Chest: 3.63 points
Upper legs: 4.00 points
Lower legs: 3.78 points

The passenger compartment held its shape well in the frontal offset test. Pedal and steering wheel displacements were well controlled. Driver and passenger contact with the airbags was stable. All doors remained closed during the crash. After the crash all doors could be opened with normal effort.

Side Impact Test.

Each body region is scored out of 4 points

Head: 4.00 points
Chest: 4.00 points
Abdomen: 4.00 points
Pelvis: 4.00 points

Good protection was provided for the driver in the side impact test. The side airbags performed well.

Pole Test.

Scored out of 2 points

The vehicle was eligible for a side pole test because it has side curtain airbags. The vehicle scored the maximum 2 points for head protection in this test.


