

This vehicle scored 36.10 out of 42 points. The Arteon has an 'active' bonnet. Sensors in the bumper detect when a pedestrian has been struck and actuators lift the bonnet, providing greater clearance to hard structures in the engine compartment. Protection was 'Good' or 'Adequate' over almost the entire surface of the bonnet. The bumper provided 'Good' protection to the legs of struck pedestrians and the pelvis area. The autonomous emergency braking (AEB) system can detect pedestrians and performed well in testing. (Tested by Euro NCAP v8.3)

The standard-fit autonomous emergency braking (AEB) system is capable of operating at highway speeds and performed well in testing. A lane keep assist system (LKA) with lane departure warning (LDW), as well as a manual speed limiter are also standard.

An intelligent seatbelt reminder is fitted to both front seats. Arteons built from November 2017 are fitted with rear seat belt reminders as standard, which improves the total *Safety Assist* score to 82% (9.90 points out of 12). Vehicles built prior to this date are not fitted with rear seat belt reminders.
