Scripture: Matthew 6:19-21, 24; Acts 20:35 (NLT)

1. Our teaching text this week stated, “Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be” (Matthew 6:21). Think about the three most valuable items in your possession and list them. How protective are you of these particular items and how would their complete loss affect you?
2. When you are instructed to “Store your treasures in heaven...” What, specifically, does that bring to mind for you? How do you store treasure in heaven?
3. Our text ends with a couple of strong statements; “No one can serve two masters for you will hate one and love the other.” Do you believe this is true?
4. Jesus’ final statement in this text is, “You cannot serve God and be enslaved to money” (Matthew 6:24). How would you define “enslaved to money?”
5. In a society that is largely driven by commerce (buying and selling), and with currency as the primary means of obtaining goods and services, how easy do you think it is to become enslaved to money? How does one resist money enslavement?
6. What would you say if you were asked, “Why is it more blessed to give than to receive?”
