Since its inception, the Florida Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus has been the leading voice for sportsmen and women in the Florida Legislature. The bicameral and bipartisan Caucus has more than 40 members hailing from all corners of the Sunshine State. The Caucus has hosted events ranging from indoor range days to dinners with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to help educate Caucus members about important sportsmen's issues, such as the American System of Conservation Funding. These events help facilitate interaction with Florida sportsmen's community and allow the Caucus to keep tabs on important sportsmen initiatives. The Caucus works closely with a range of conservation partners to protect and advance Florida's sporting traditions.

Policy Highlights

- In 2023, the Caucus was instrumental in passing HJR 1157, which put the right to hunt and fish, including the use of traditional methods, constitutional amendment on the ballot for Florida voters in 2024.
- In 2020, the Caucus was instrumental in the passage of legislation (SB 1414) which expanded the statute prohibiting the harassment of hunters, anglers, and trappers by extending protections to sportsmen and women on public lands and waters.
- The Caucus has been instrumental over the years defeating numerous bills that would have negatively impacted sporting dog owners.
