The Indiana Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus was formed in 2011 as a bi-partisan, bi-cameral Caucus of likeminded legislators. These legislators shared a passion for the outdoors that crossed party lines and saw a need to conserve the strong sporting heritage in the state. Since then they have worked to promote science-based conservation policy and protect hunting, fishing, and trapping in the Hoosier state, through the North American Model of Wildlife Conservation and American System of Conservation Funding. Currently leading the Caucus is Sen. David Niezgodski, Sen. Jim Tomes, and Rep. Bob Morris.

Policy Highlights

- Protected Hoosier sportsmen and women from having their firearm, ammunition, or other purchases as sporting good stores tracked by either the state or private credit card companies.
- Expressly authorized the Indiana Department of Natural Resources to establish a season for taking bobcats and promulgate science-based management principles surrounding that season.
- Secured the continued use of high-powered rifles on private lands.
