## **Policy Highlights**

- In 2023, 4 anti-firearm bills that would have drastically impacted conservation funding in the state failed to make it through the legislative process.
- Despite strong opposition from both the Caucus and outdoor sporting community, SB 32 which banned trapping on public lands in the state was enacted at the end of the 2021 session.
- In 2021, SB 224 would have made it illegal for children under 12 years of age to access or handle a firearm, but it failed to reach the Governors desk before end of session.
