Since inception, the Idaho Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus has continued to work for benefit of conservation and Idaho's sporting community by advocating for pro-sportsmen's policy in Boise. Milestone accomplishments have included legislation as authorizing the establishment of a Hunters Feeding the Hungry program, allowing children with life threatening medical conditions to participate in specific hunts, banning internet hunting, instituting an apprentice hunting program and amending the Idaho Constitution to protect the right to hunt, fish, and trap. ILSC continues to maintain a collaborative relationship with the Idaho Department of Fish and Game, the Fish and Game Commission and their sportsmen and women constituents.



Policy Highlights

- 2023 SB 1143 Expanded the regulatory authority of IDFG to include season setting and restrictions to shed antler, horn, and deadhead collecting, gathering and possession.
- 2022 HB 702/SB 1422 -Provided an additional \$2 million for hunting and fishing access at no additional cost to the Idaho's outdoor sporting community.
- 2021 SB 1020 Provides private property protections while simultaneously encouraging free recreational access to the public.
