The Alabama Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus has been the leading voice for sportsmen and women in the Alabama Legislature. The bicameral and bipartisan Caucus has more than 100 members hailing from all corners of the Yellowhammer State. The Caucus hosts an annual policy breakfast at the Capitol that is well attended by the sportsmen's community and helps educate Caucus members about issues impacting hunters, anglers, recreational shooters, and trappers in Alabama.

Policy Highlights

- In 2021, Caucus leadership was instrumental in the passage of legislation (SB 264) that allowed feral swine and coyotes to be hunted at night on privately owned or leased land.
- In 2019, the Caucus spearheaded the passage of a resolution (HJR 265) commending efforts to secure state management of red snapper and support state management of all recreationally important saltwater fish species.
- In 2017, the Caucus was instrumental in the passage of House Bill 3, which allowed full-time nonresident students at colleges and universities in the state to purchase resident hunting and fishing licenses to support hunter recruitment, retention, and reactivation efforts.
