## **Policy Highlights**

- In 2024 Caucus Co-Chair, Representative Western co-sponsored HB 67 refining the Wyoming Outdoor Recreation and Tourism Fund, and giving sportsmen a seat on the board responsible for the fund's management.
- In 2021, GSC Member Governor Gordon enacted HB 122, increased the conservation stamp fee to fund improved wildlife conservation efforts while also expanding public land access and opportunities.
- In 2012, Wyoming passed SJR 1 and amended the state constitution to protect the right to hunt, fish and trap with more than 80% of the vote in the general election.
