NEBRASKA LEGISLATIVE SPORTSMEN'S FORUM

The Nebraska Legislative Sportsmen's Forum was established in 2004 with the creation of the National Assembly of Sportsmen's Caucuses (NASC) network. Since its inception, the Forum has effectively served the sportsmen's community in The Cornhusker State. Today, the Nebraska Legislative Sportsmen's Forum works closely with the Congressional Sportsmen's Foundation (CSF) and the Nebraska Sportsmen's Foundation (NSF) to protect and advance Nebraska's rich and storied sporting heritage.

Policy Highlights

- 2018: With the passage of LB 321 it exempted members of a college or university firearms team who
 possess weapons used for competition from laws regarding the unlawful possession of a firearm on school
 grounds.
- 2019: As it has in previous sessions, the Nebraska Legislative Sportsmen's Forum, with the help of the sportsmen's and conservation communities successfully defended against a bill to end mountain lion hunting in Nebraska.
- 2021: With the successful defense against NE LB 615, the sportsmen's community effectively prevented partisan politics from impacting the conservation operations of the Nebraska Game and Parks Commision.

Economic Impact

- The 137,000 hunters of Nebraska support 7,600 jobs, contribute \$294 million towards salaries and wages, and provide \$50 million in state and local taxes.
- Nebraska's 126,000 recreational shooters support 1,700 jobs, contribute \$56 million towards salaries and wages, and provide \$9 million in state and local taxes.
- The 405,900 anglers of Nebraska support 2,910 jobs and have an economic output of \$423.4 million.
