WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE SPORTSMEN'S CAUCUS

Established in 2015, the Wisconsin Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus is a member of the National Assembly of Sportsmen's Caucuses (NASC). Since that time, the Caucus has championed legislation that benefits Wisconsin's sportsmen and women, as well as the Badger State's natural resources. In addition, the Caucus has played a central role in assisting CSF with generating support from the Wisconsin Congressional delegation on important federal legislation that benefits our natural resources and our outdoor heritage in Wisconsin and across the nation.

Guided by bipartisan leadership, the Caucus remains engaged on issues that affect the nation's original conservationists by protecting and advancing hunting, angling, recreational shooting, and trapping within the Badger State. Policy Highlights

- In recent years, the Wisconsin Legislative Sportsmen's Caucus has worked to protect and advance pro-sportsmen legislation pertaining to conservation funding, public access, and hunting regulations.
- The Wisconsin Sportsmen's Caucus has also fought against tournament bans, egregious firearm bans, and other threats to our outdoor heritage.

Economic Impact

- The 857,000 hunters of Wisconsin support 25,000 jobs, contribute \$1.021 billion towards salaries and wages, and provide \$209 million in state and local taxes.
- Wisconsin's 404,800 recreational shooters support 3,800 jobs, contribute \$127 million towards salaries and wages, and provide \$24 million in state and local taxes.
- The 2,087,000 anglers of Wisconsin support 12,180 jobs and have economic output of \$1.7 billion.
