Introduction

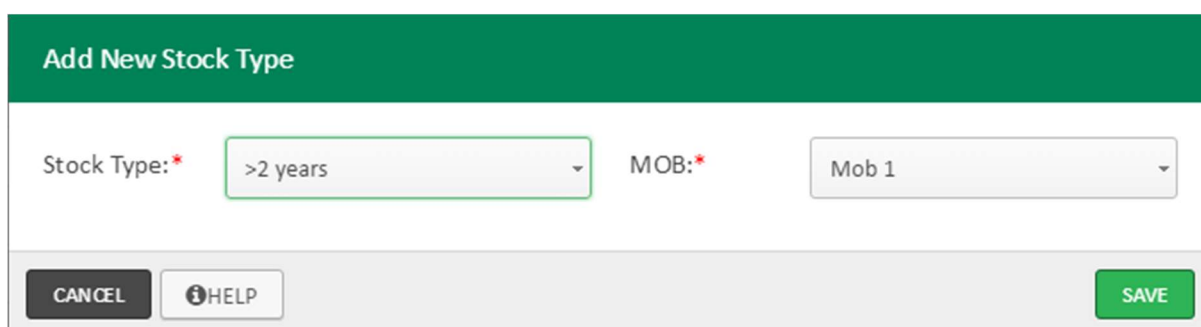
This screen allows you to pick the types of stock that are grazing on your measured land area. It also allows you to manage groups of animals that are confined to groups of paddocks.

Do I need to use mobs?

If you have 25 paddocks and 1 group of milking cows on these 25 paddocks than you do not need to use mobs, just keep all paddocks and all animals in 'Mob 1'

If you have 25 paddocks and a group of sheep rotate around paddocks 1 to 10 and a group of cattle rotate around paddocks 11 to 25, then mobs are ideal. In this case put paddocks 1 to 10 in 'Mob 1' and put the sheep stock types in 'Mob 1'. Then put paddocks 11 to 25 in 'Mob 2' and put all cattle stock types in 'Mob 2'. If the cattle and sheep could be grazed in any of the 25 paddocks at any time, then the use of mobs is not needed – in this case put all sheep and cattle in 'Mob 1' and all paddocks in 'Mob 1'

Add New Stock Type



In the above screen click on the menu on the left to pick the stock types that are grazing on your measured grass wedge.

If you have only one group of animals on the measured area of land, leave all stock types in 'Mob 1'

You can put the same stock type in more than 1 mob of paddocks.
