More Fun Less Mess

With the materials in this kit, we take a new spin on an old classic - Finger Painting.

Designed for Preschoolers, this kit includes 6 washable finger paints and a re-usable painting station that helps keep their creations and paints contained. We also include thoughtful extras like a plastic apron, squeegee, print roller and a clean up sponge.

Read the directions to your child and help them set up their Fingerprints Painting Set, then step back and watch the creativity begin.

Important Information About the Paint:

- The paint included in your set is a specially formulated non-toxic, washable finger paint.
- Cover your work surface with newspaper. Have a cup of water and paper towels handy for clean up.
- Wear old clothes and the apron included in your set. Although this paint is washable it could stain some surfaces. Clean up spills immediately with soap and water.
- Paint can settle and separate over time. If needed, mix each color before you begin painting. If the paint seems too thick, stir in a drop or two of water.
- Wipe off your fingers before changing colors.

Painting

Put your apron on, roll up your sleeves and you are ready to paint and print.

Find a good spot to place your work station. We recommend placing newspaper under your tray. Have a cup of water and some paper towels handy for quick clean up.

Place your sponge in the yellow tray and lightly moisten it with water. Set your roller and print paper next to your painting station. Carefully remove the lids from your paints and set them aside – keep the paints inside the tray.


Place your clear plastic painting mat (printed with Creativity For Kids® logo) inside the well of the tray.

Dip your fingers into the paint and start painting. The paint will flow smoothly over this plastic surface. Encourage your child to have fun and be creative.



Before switching colors, wipe off your fingers with the sponge or your paper towels.

Use the foam squeegee to make lines, designs or textures. Use the sponge or your paper towels to wipe away any excess paint.



Printing

Once your painting is complete, it's time to make a print.

Start with clean hands - Use the paper towels or sponge to wipe them off. Take a sheet of your printing paper and place it over your painting inside the well of the tray.

Take the roller and move it back and forth over the clean back of the paper covering the whole surface.



Carefully pull the paper off of the painted surface and voila! - you will have a print of your painting. Set your print aside to dry.

If your painting mat still has leftover paint, you can make another print, make a new painting, or wipe it all off and start from scratch. You can use your squeegee and sponge to help remove paint as well. If your painting tray is super-messy, you can rinse it off in the sink – just remove the jars of paint first. You can also rinse the clear plastic mat off in the sink.

Suitable for Framing

Displaying your child's artwork in a prominent place can give them the confidence they need to keep creating. Encourage your child to be creative and let them know that there is no right or wrong way for them to paint as long as they are having fun.

Ideas of Things to Paint

Maybe your child is an abstract artist, or maybe they will want to paint a realistic object like a flower, the sun, house, pet, family member, a favorite animal, a handprint, bug, or fish.

Remember, if they paint a name, letters or numbers when the print is made the art will be in reverse. Ready for a challenge? Try painting your name backwards and then make a print.

If you run out of paper, no worries. This tray is designed to fit standard 8 ½ x 11 sized paper.
