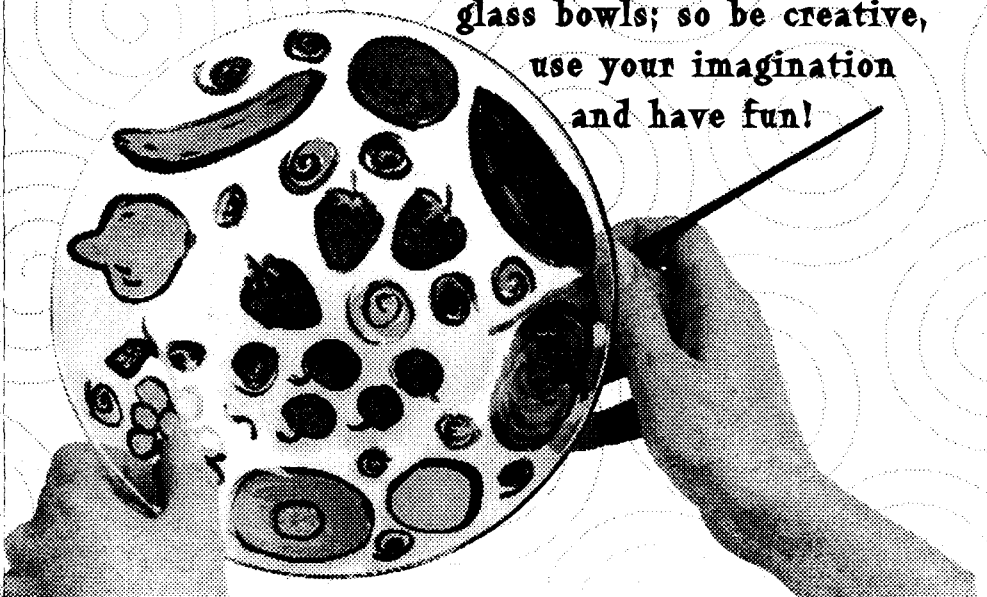

Important Information About This Paint!

- The paint included is a specially formulated non-toxic ceramic paint that dries permanently on most surfaces, so be careful.
- Cover your work surface with newspaper. Have a cup of water and paper towels handy.
- Wear a smock or old clothes. This paint may stain fabrics and furniture. Clean up any spills immediately while the paint is still wet.
- Paint can settle and separate over time. Mix each color thoroughly before you begin painting. If the paint seems too thick, stir in a drop or two of water.
- Before changing colors, rinse and dry your brush thoroughly.



You Can Experiment mixing the paint colors to create new ones.

Pink + Yellow = Orange

Green + Yellow = Light Green

Blue + White = Light Blue

Pink + White = Light Pink

Blue + Green = Teal

PAINTING YOUR BOWLS

BEFORE YOU BEGIN PAINTING- It is very important that you thoroughly clean the bowls with dish washing liquid and water.

If the bowls are not clean the paint will not adhere to the glass. Make sure the bowls are completely rinsed and dried before you begin painting.

First decide how you want to decorate your bowls. You can paint them any way you like, just be sure to keep in mind the size of the bowls and how much paint you have. You don't have to paint the entire bowl. Leave some areas unpainted so that you can see through the glass. Use your imagination, creativity and memory for inspiration. You can paint a bowl to celebrate a special event, such as a birthday party or a favorite holiday. You can paint your bowl to look like your favorite food, pet snacks, or a fun design.

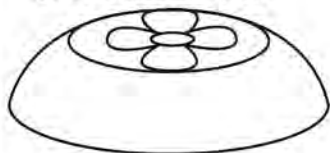
REVERSE GLASS PAINTING

You will be using the technique of reverse glass painting to decorate the bowls. When you paint the backside of the bowls and look at them from the other side, you will see the reverse of what you painted. Your design will be magnified and brighter. It is a very cool optical effect.

Painting the back of the bowls

To reverse paint on the bowls, paint the foreground first, then paint the background. For example to paint a flower:

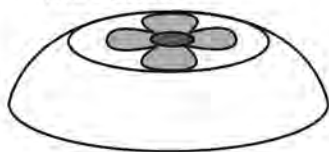
1. Paint the outline of the flower first.



2. Paint the center of the flower and the foreground.



3. Paint the petals of the flower.

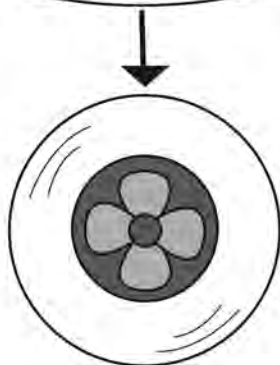


4. Paint the background of the flower.



NOTE- Allow the paint to dry one hour between each coat of paint. This will keep the colors bright and help the paint to cure and become permanent.

If you are not pleased with your designs, wash the paint off immediately with soap and water. Rinse, dry and then try again.



When your painting is finished, set it aside to dry completely. This will allow the paint to "cure" and become permanent. Depending on the heat and humidity where you live, this could take as long as one week. For best results allow the paint to cure in a warm dry place.

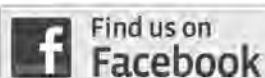
Note: Please treat your bowls as special accessories. Always carefully hand wash your bowls. Do not put them in a dishwasher. Using and washing your bowls everyday can affect how they look.

If any paint chips off of your bowls you can touch it up using leftover paint. Be sure to "re-cure" the bowls after retouching them.
