

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **Paint Warning:** The paint included is a non-toxic, acrylic paint that dries permanently on most surfaces, so be careful.
- Paint can settle and separate over time. Mix each color thoroughly before you begin painting. If the paint seems too thick, stir in a drop or two of water.

1. Set Up


- Cover your work surface with old newspaper or plastic to protect it from paint spills.
- Put on a smock or work shirt to protect your clothing from paint.
- Fill a container with water for cleaning your brush. Rinse and dry your brush before changing colors.
- Get a small rag or paper towels for clean-up.


2. Painting by Number


- For this kit, where you place the colors will determine how 3-dimensional the finished piece will appear when viewing them with your 3D glasses. The color that will pop off the page the most is the neon red. The next colors that will pop off are neon orange and pink. The green, blue and yellow will stay in the background. To create more depth, place a color that pops next to a color that stays in the background.
- You can paint your design using your own color choices or use the Painting Number Guide to see which paint color should be used in each section.
- Begin at the top of the board and paint all sections with the same number.
- Clean your brush before moving on to another color.


Color Key

Paint colors 1 through 6 are labeled directly on the paint pots.


 (Color 1) = Blue

 (Color 2) = Green

 (Color 3) = Yellow

 (Color 4) = Orange

 (Color 5) = Red

 (Color 6) = Pink

3. Finishing

- When all sections are painted, review your work and add any finishing touches. You may need to add a second coat of paint to some colors.
- Allow the paint to dry completely before applying the double-sided tape to the bottom, top and across the middle of the backside. Center the painting over the Foam Mounting Board and press to attach. Attach the sticky-back Hang Tab to hang it on your wall!
- Put your 3D glasses on and view your art. Focus on the red areas for a few seconds and relax your eyes. You should see your painting pop!
