Educators have long known that a student's needs must be met before meaningful learning can occur. In this practical guide, Scott Edgar empowers music teachers to prioritize student well-being through embedded life-skill development in the music classroom.

To better understand the unprecedented challenges today's students face, Edgar surveyed K-12 music teachers and students nationwide. He found that students—across a range of grades and contexts—consistently experience the following challenges:

- · Struggles with self-management and impulse control
- Difficulty balancing expectations
- Fear of taking risks or being vulnerable
- Lack of resilience

For each challenge, Edgar explores typical student behaviors and suggests practical ways teachers can offer support. He also presents real-life scenarios ranging from elementary to high school that demonstrate thoughtful teacher responses to common challenging situations.



In addition, Yorel Lashley shares an adaptable framework for centering student voices and embedding life-skill development in the music classroom. Darlene Machacon also contributes a chapter on the power of culturally responsive teaching, inviting educators to use music as a tool for social impact and student empowerment.

Needs Before Notes is a must-have resource for developing the ability to read student behavior and respond with empathy while also teaching important life skills for music and beyond.

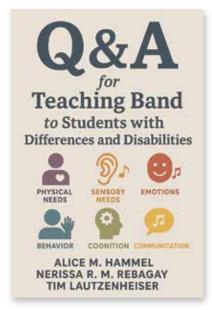
Every student deserves the chance to make music. In *Q&A* for *Teaching Band to Students with Differences* and *Disabilities*, leading practitioners Alice Hammel, Nerissa Rebagay, and Tim Lautzenheiser respond to real questions submitted by real teachers about how to include *all* students:

- How can I be as inclusive as possible for students with physical differences?
- How do I keep students with ADHD on task?
- What are practical strategies to use with students on the autism spectrum?
- How can I positively engage students with behavioral issues in a large class?

Notably, the authors draw on the social model of disability, which focuses on what students *can* do and how educators can create supportive environments. The questions are organized according to the model's six domains: (1) behavior, (2) cognition, (3) communication, (4) emotions, (5) sensory needs, and (6) physical/medical needs.

An additional chapter covers related topics of importance, including working with paraprofessionals, Universal Design for Learning, IEPs, 504 plans, and legal and ethical considerations.

Practical and affirming, this resource empowers band directors to lead with both skill and empathy, one inclusive rehearsal at a time.

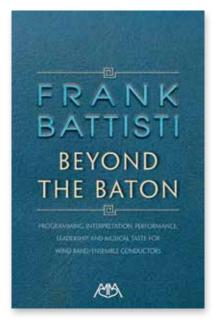

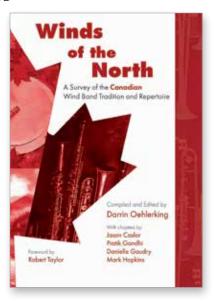

Winds of the North: A Survey of the Canadian Wind Band Tradition and Repertoire highlights the importance of Canadian contributions to wind band and music education practices. This substantial volume explores the unique history of wind band in Canada, balanced with contemporary perspectives and representative repertoire.

The chapters in Part I cover a range of topics, including an overview of Canadian wind band history, French-Canadian perspectives (presented in both French and English), decolonizing wind band practices, meaningful Indigenous collaborations, and other important legacies and contemporary issues. Significantly, all chapters are presented through a twenty-first-century lens.

Part II offers scholarly resource guides for 85 of the best works by Canadian composers, categorized by difficulty for developing, intermediate, experienced, and advanced bands. Each guide presents information about the composer and the work's composition, historical and cultural perspectives, stylistic considerations, pedagogical information, and an overview of the work's form and structure. Rounding out each guide are suggested resources and recordings.

This landmark resource pays homage to the creativity and community that define the Canadian wind band tradition, celebrating its past while inspiring the musicians and educators who will shape its future.



Darrin Oehlerking, compiler and editor of this volume, serves as Associate Dean of Student Affairs for the College of Arts and Science at the University of Saskatchewan (USask) and is Professor of Music in the USask School for the Arts. He has previously served as president of both the Canadian Band Association and the Saskatchewan Band Association, has directed numerous honour bands, and has served as an adjudicator, conference presenter, and clinician across Canada, the United States, and Europe.

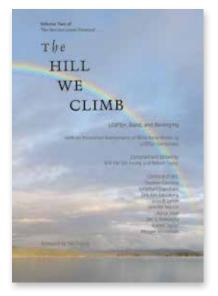

The Hill We Climb deepens the conversation about equity and inclusion started by The Horizon Leans Forward . . . This companion volume centers the voices and lived experiences of LGBTQ+ musicians, artists, and educators in the wind band community, and explores how music can foster belonging and LGBTQ+ visibility across classrooms, ensembles, and institutions.

The first half of the book features essays, interviews, and personal narratives authored by LGBTQ+ and ally contributors as they reflect on identity, advocacy, and the role of the conductor-educator in fostering belonging and allyship.

The second half presents an annotated bibliography showcasing more than 70 LGBTQ+ composers and 160 of their best works for wind band, Grades I-VI. To support inclusive programming, each entry offers a brief biography of the composer, pertinent publication information, and descriptions of each work.

The Hill We Climb is both a resource and a call to action, urging music educators to listen with empathy, lead with courage, and shape a more inclusive and compassionate future for all LGBTQ+ students and musicians.



As someone whose fight for love and dignity became part of a national conversation, I know firsthand how vital it is for queer individuals—especially young people—to feel seen, valued, and supported. Music programs offer LGBTQ+ students an outlet for creativity and, when acceptance and inclusion are denied elsewhere, a much-needed refuge where they are free to be themselves. 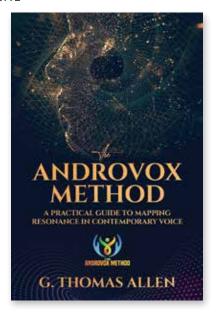

G. Thomas Allen, Associate Professor of Voice at Berklee College of Music, is an award-winning vocalist, voice educator, and author whose groundbreaking work merges vocal artistry with science-based pedagogy. With a career that spans opera, jazz, gospel, and contemporary commercial music (CCM), Allen is best known for his agile, resonant sound and innovative approach to vocal technique. He made history as the first male winner of the prestigious Sarah Vaughan International Jazz Vocal Competition and was later recognized by DownBeat magazine for his signature falsetto and genredefying vocal expression.

Previously, he taught at Columbia College Chicago (CCC), where he developed and led workshop courses that helped shape *The ANDROVOX Method*, a contemporary vocal system grounded in resonance mapping and vocal agility. Drawing from his experience as both a performer and pedagogue, the method reframes traditional vocal registers into low-density resonance (LDR), mid-density resonance (MDR), and high-density resonance (HDR), providing singers with a clear, gender-inclusive framework rooted in anatomy, acoustics, agility, and authenticity. Allen's research and teaching challenge the limitations of classical-centric training models, advocating for an inclusive and functional pedagogy that honors the wide spectrum of vocal expression.

Beyond the classroom, Allen has been featured on GRAMMY-nominated recordings and has performed at the Monterey Jazz Festival, BBC Proms, and Saturday Night Live, to name a few highlights. Whether on stage, in the studio, or in academic spaces, G. Thomas Allen continues to shape the future of voice training—empowering the next generation of singers with technique, truth, and innovation.

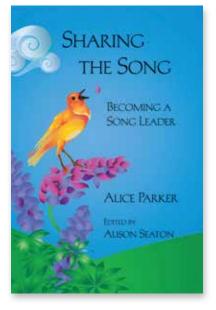

Over a career that spanned more than seventy years, Alice Parker gifted choral musicians with a wide range of creative output that embraced composing, conducting, and teaching. Her training at Smith College and Juilliard, her collaborations with Robert Shaw, and her life well and fully lived resulted in a body of work that encompasses hundreds of songs rich in history and beautiful melodies. Alice was a generous mentor with a keen and articulate teaching style, and her use of song as a way to build community was a delight to all who experienced her creative presence.

All children can learn to improvise musically, given the right music experiences and instruction. And through improvisation they can express their own musical ideas and take ownership of their musicianship. Yet teachers are reluctant to incorporate improvisation into their instruction because they feel unprepared to teach it.

Designed for elementary general music as well as middle and high school choir, *Learning to Improvise* provides hundreds of detailed teaching plans, dozens of songs, and numerous practical strategies and extensions to develop improvisation readiness and skills. Authors Cynthia Taggart and David Potter also provide a pathway for teachers to develop their own improvisational skills through the teaching plans and provided audio recordings.

Organized into four parts based on common harmonic functions in major and minor tonalities, this book focuses on developing harmonic audiation, which lies at the core of successful improvisation. It gives students strong models of improvisation and scaffolded opportunities that facilitate success while learning to improvise.

In addition to teaching plans, Taggart and Potter also provide extensive lists of popular music and links to recordings for each harmonic function so that teachers can incorporate popular music into their teaching, bridging the gap between classroom music and the music that students encounter in their daily lives.



Cynthia Taggart is Professor Emeritus of Music Education at Michigan State University, where she directed and taught in the Early Childhood Music Program of the Community Music School, served as Chair of Music Education and Associate Director for Graduate Studies, and taught courses on music in early childhood, elementary general music, measurement, research, and the psychology of music. She is a past president of the Gordon Institute for Music Learning (GIML) and the College Music Society.

David Potter is the Associate Professor and Coordinator of Music Education at the University of Wisconsin–Superior, where he founded the university's community music school. He teaches undergraduate courses in music learning methods, ear training, and songwriting, as well as early childhood and elementary music classes at the community music school. He is an active researcher and clinician whose interests include creativity, improvisation, and the development of audiation.

Most recently, he served as the Felton J. Capel Distinguished Professor of Performing and Fine Arts at Fayetteville State University in North Carolina.
