### JTFGB Director to Receive Hebrew College Esther Award for Leadership & Philanthropy

On May 30, Leah Goldstein, the Director of <u>Jewish Teen Foundation of Greater Boston</u> (JTFGB) at Hebrew College, will be honored with the Esther Award at Hebrew College's annual spring fundraiser, <u>Hebrew College Live! Stories in Honor of Our Teachers</u>. The event, to be held at Temple Beth Elohim in Wellesley, recognizes Goldstein's work in helping Boston-area teens learn the ins and outs of professional philanthropy and raise nearly \$150,000 for 22 different non-profits.

"Leah Goldstein is a devoted teacher and mentor who has been and continues to be an inspiration to hundreds of teens, empowering them to become part of the unfolding story of the Jewish people by nurturing their own passion for leadership, philanthropy, and social change," said Hebrew College President Rabbi Sharon Cohen Anisfeld. "As we present the Esther Award this year at our spring fundraising event honoring generations of teachers at Hebrew College, we are delighted to honor Leah and celebrate the profound impact of her holy work."

Goldstein has spearheaded the highly successful JTFGB program, now in its fourth year, since its inception. The program offers Jewish high school students from all different denominational backgrounds across the greater Boston area the opportunity to learn through a Jewish lens how to successfully run a foundation and move through the grant-making cycle. Students raise funds and allocate grants to effect real change in the causes they care about most.

"I get really proud. When teens finish the program, a lot of them say, 'I want to go work for a nonprofit,' or 'I can't wait to be able to donate myself to non-profits.' That melts my heart," says Goldstein. "I love seeing that the teens are taking what they've learned from their JTFGB experience and applying it to their everyday lives. Given the world that we live in now, it gives me hope for the

future."

## The 8th Day of Passover: A Mo'ed For New Leadership

Congratulations, friends, you have journeyed through another Passover, and hopefully feel a greater sense of liberation as the holiday draws to a close on Saturday night.

In truth, the last few days of *Pesach* are a poor man's parallel to the final hours of Yom Kippur - but you've made it this far, so why not go all the way! In fact, consider going to synagogue to listen to one of the more remarkable texts from the ancient prophet Isaiah.

The text focuses on the prophet's vision of Assyria's defeat and the return of the Jewish exiles to the Land of Israel, which will usher in an era of peace and harmony. Perhaps the most famous verses from this messianic reading come from chapter 11, verses 6-9:

The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, the leopard lie down with the kid/
The calf, the beast of prey, and the fatling together, with a little boy to herd them/
The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together/
And the lion, like the ox, shall eat straw/
A babe shall play Over a viper's hole/
And an infant pass his hand over an adder's den/

In all of My sacred mount Nothing evil or vile shall be done/ For the land shall be filled with devotion to the LORD/ As water covers the sea.

Embedded in Isaiah's inspiring language, is a significant intergenerational message. Hang in there for a moment while I set the table for you.
