GRAMMAR

The focus of this lesson is Self Introduction in Spanish

Topic 1: How to Introduce yourself (1st way)

Sentence from the lesson:

'Hola, soy Lucia. Mucho gusto.'

"Hi, I'm Lucia. Nice to meet you."

1. The first word is *Hola*, which means "hi," or "hello."
2. Then comes *soy*, which means "I am." *Hola, soy...*
3. Say your name. *Hola, soy Lucia.* means "Hi, I'm Lucia."
4. You say *Mucho gusto*, which means "nice to meet you."

Topic 2: How to Introduce yourself (2nd way)

Sentence from the lesson:

'Hola, me llamo Lucia. Mucho gusto.'

"Hi, my name is Lucia. Nice to meet you."

1. There is also another way to say your name. Instead of *Soy Lucia*, I could say *Me llamo Lucia*.
2. *Me llamo...* literally means "I call myself." But we use it to mean "my name is."

Language Tip!

In formal situations, people in Spanish speaking countries greet each other by shaking hands. On the other hand, if we meet someone we are very friendly with, we kiss each other on both cheeks. So don't be surprised if this happens to you!
