n August 1, 2006, numerous providers of interconnected VOIP services filed Form 499Q with the FCC for the first time. The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") imposed this filing requirement in its order addressing various Universal Service Fund issues released on June 27, 2006.

The Telecommunications Practice Group at Kelley Drye & Warren LLC ("Kelley Drye") has advised numerous providers of interconnected VOIP services on complying with the Form 499Q requirement as well as related FCC regulations and policies. All parties who filed Form 499Q on August 1, 2006 have 45 days in which to revise their filings to ensure that all information is accurate and complete. This 45-day window may be particularly important for providers of interconnected VOIP services who have not previously
