The article covers how the Supreme Court's decision in *Loper Bright Enterprises v. Raimondo*, which overturned *Chevron*, will affect judicial review in international trade and customs litigation.

The article begins with a summary of *Chevron's* two-step framework for a court to determine the validity of an agency's interpretation of statutory text, and the framework's role in trade law. The authors then situate the *Loper Bright* decision within the statutory framework governing the Court of International Trade. The authors find that most antidumping and countervailing dumping cases will be largely unaffected by the *Loper Bright* decision.
