Paxton* denying a First Amendment challenge to a Texas law requiring online publishers of sexual content to verify the ages of Texas users likely represents a narrow holding applicable only to obscene content. But the court’s analysis raises broader questions that bear on the constitutionality of other age verification provisions.”
