

Unresolved Questions in the Wake of the U.S. Supreme Court's Class Arbitration Ruling in *Stolt-Nielsen v. AnimalFeeds International*

The article focuses on the Supreme Court's decision in *Stolt-Nielsen v. AnimalFeeds Int'l.*, which ruled on when class action procedures can be used in arbitration. The article discusses Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg's dissenting opinion which could, according to partner [Bob Crotty](#), "eviscerate the majority opinion because class action arbitration arises most often in consumer transactions and employment contexts, areas Ginsburg presumably referred to as 'contracts of adhesion.'"
