SMFM Fellow tip of the week

Blood pressure = Flow x **Resistance**. Therefore. the blood pressure is elevated because of either too much flow or too much resistance. The pulse pressure (difference between the systolic and diastolic blood pressure) represents flow (abnormal if >55) and is best treated with a beta blocker. The diastolic blood pressure represents resistance or vasoconstriction (abnormal if >105) and
