

Childcare at The Pregnancy Meeting™ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

For the first-time ever, we are offering childcare services at The Pregnancy Meeting™ in 2019. This FAQ document aims to answer some of the questions collected from the MFM Moms Facebook group in August 2018. If we missed something, please contact Terri Mobley at tmobley@smfm.org.

When will childcare services be available?

Childcare will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis on February 11-15 from 7:00 AM – 7:00 PM and on February 16 from 7:00 AM to 1:00 PM. Children may be enrolled for no more than 10 hours per day.

Who will be watching my child(ren)?

We have contracted with KiddieCorp for childcare services. Now in its 33rd year of providing children's programs and youth services at conventions and special events, KiddieCorp meets the requirements established for licensed childcare providers in the state of Nevada. All childcare providers must be at least 18 years old, have at least one year of child care experience, and are carefully screened by Kiddie Corp. All KiddieCorp managers are CPR/First Aid certified.

What is the ratio of staff to children?

KiddieCorp's staff-to-child ratios are as follows:

- 1:2 for children ages 6 weeks through 11 months old
- 1:3 for children ages 1 through 2 years old
- 1:5 for children ages 3 through 5 years old
- 1:7 for children ages 6 through 10 years old

What ages will be accepted?

The childcare program is for children ages 6 weeks through 10 years old. To ensure a safe and fun-filled environment, any child who is ill will not be admitted to the children's program.

Where will the childcare services be located?

The childcare services will be located in the Sicily Room at Caesar's Palace. This room is on the same level as some of the postgraduate courses, and relatively close to the space where we will hold the oral plenary sessions. Parents are welcome to drop-in to visit or feed their children.

What is the security system for entering and leaving the room?

Kiddie Corp uses a photo ID security procedure for check-in and check-out of children. Children and their parents are always escorted by KiddieCorp team members when entering or leaving the children's program area for any reason.

What is the cost? What is included in the cost?

The cost to parents is \$20/hour per child. Children must be registered for at least two consecutive hours. Should a parent be late in picking up their child, a fee of \$5 per child every 5 minutes will be charged.

Pack-n-plays, sleep mats, high chairs and a small refrigerator will be made available in the childcare space. We will also provide the following meals: continental breakfast, morning and afternoon snacks, and lunch. No peanuts will be provided.

If a child has any special food requirements (e.g. organic food, vegan, gluten free, etc.) parents will be responsible for providing food. For children that require breastmilk or formula, parents are required to provide it.

Parents are also responsible for any pillows or blankets for naps/resting, diapers and wipes, bottles, a change of clothes and any favorite toys.

What is the configuration of the childcare room? What activities will be planned?

Up to 18 children and all of the childcare providers will be in one large room. The youngest children (infants – 2 years old) will be on one side of the space and the older children on the other side. Activities are tailored to the group depending on age and include arts and crafts, group games, music and movement, board games, story time, dramatic play, etc.

Where will children nap?

On the infant side of the room, there will be pack-n-plays and mats available for naps. KiddieCorp will do their best to put the children down for a nap after lunch and while a movie is playing for the older children (to minimize noise), but there is no guarantee that they will sleep.

Is the childcare room smoke-free?

Yes.

What if my child has an allergy?

KiddieCorp takes allergies very seriously. During the registration process, please indicate any allergies your child may have. These will be listed on the child's nametag and they will wear a red wristband that lists the allergies so everyone in the room is aware.

How will childcare providers get in touch with parents?

KiddieCorp managers carry cell phones, which are used to communicate with parents, as needed. This is typically done with calls or texts, as cell signal can be spotty in some hotels.
