Shipping Information

We begin shipping all plants in early spring as weather permits in your region and ours. Our plants are guaranteed to arrive healthy and ready to transplant. Please note that some states have special restrictions and do not allow certain materials to be shipped into the state. PLEASE refer to the culture boxes in each section for state shipping restrictions and check with your state's Department of Agriculture. No shipments of any kind can be made to APO/FPO, HI, PR, or other countries outside the United States. Seeds only to AK.

Check Acceptance Policy

When you provide a check payment, you authorize us to process a one-time ACH debit entry for up to the amount of your check. You also authorize us to process credit adjustments to your bank account if a refund is needed. If you have insufficient funds to cover your payment, you authorize us to collect your payment plus a fee of \$40 from your account. Funds may be withdrawn from your account on the same day we receive your payment. Sending a paper check increases processing time and you may not receive your check back from your financial institution.

Our liability for the breach of this guarantee whether contractual, for negligence, or for any other reason, is limited to a credit voucher for the purchase price of the seeds which shall constitute full and complete adjustment and release.

A credit voucher will be issued one time for any plant materials that fail to grow, provided we are notified by October 1 of the year of purchase and the item has been properly cared for and in the planting zone noted in the catalog. Annual plants such as tomatoes, peppers, and herbs are only guaranteed to arrive in good shape. If there is a problem upon arrival, please notify us immediately (within 10 days) so we can resolve this situation for you.

We guarantee you complete satisfaction with our gardening supplies (non-growing items) when used according to the manufacturer's instructions. Report of unsatisfactory garden accessories must be reported within 30 days for a credit voucher or refund. Only manufacturer's guarantee (if any) applies after 30 days. We reserve the right to request return of the product deemed unsatisfactory prior to approval of any adjustment.

Seed Tapes

Seed Tapes are a great way to get the most out of your garden seed. The specially designed tissue paper has seed embedded for perfect depth and spacing every time. Simply make a shallow furrow in your garden, place the seed tape in the furrow and cover with a little soil, peat moss, or compost, then water. Make sure to thoroughly water your seed tapes so the tissue paper can disintegrate properly as the seed is germinating. The tapes are used on small seeded vegetables such as carrots, radishes, and beets to ensure consistency and uniformity. If you've had poor luck with small-

seeded veggies in the past, try seed tapes! Small-seeded veggies available as seed tapes are highlighted in blue below the regular priceline.

NEW! 63-65 Day. Pole Bean. Attractive plants and tasty pods make this an edible-ornamental. Impressive 6' vines with a purple hue, yield lovely violet flowers and large, stringless, meaty, reddish-purple, 5-7" pods with a green interior. Found by Henry Fields in an Ozark garden in the 1930's, and grown by generations of gardeners ever since. We preferred the flavor when the seeds were starting to form in the pod. Light-green when cooked.

♣ Improved Golden Wax

NEW! 50-52 Day. Bush Bean. If you are new to gardening, give this dependable variety a try. Compact, hardy, 16-19" plants yield a generous amount of 4-6", bright yellow, stringless pods with good flavor. Resistant to BCMV and rust, plants stay healthy all summer and will keep bearing as long as beans are kept picked. Popular in northern climates for their early maturity and use as a canning, freezing or fresh bean.

Armenian Yard Long

NEW! 50-75 Day. Melon. We weren't sure about this "cucumber" either until we grew it in our test garden. But tasting is believing, and we had to offer it in the catalog! Technically a melon, the prolific vines yield an abundance of light-green, ribbed, 12-18" fruits that have a thin, easily digestible skin and mildly sweet flavor. Eats like a cucumber but keeps better than one once cut and stored in the refrigerator.

Crunchy King Hybrid

NEW! 23-25 Day. Radish. Enjoy radishes longer with this variety. Incredible holding ability in the garden allowed us to harvest over an extended period of time without it botting or becoming pithy. Uniform, round, red radishes have a bright white interior and good flavor. Does well all season, but best if planted in spring and fall.

Purple Orach

NEW! 45 Day. Orach. An interesting alternative to spinach. A cool season garden green that tolerates a wide range of temperatures and can be harvested later into summer without leaves becoming bitter. The smooth, 2", reddish-purple leaves are similar in flavor to spinach. For "cut-and-come-again" harvests, cut tightly spaced plants 1-2" above the soil when plants are 4-6" tall, or allow to grow and harvest young, tender leaves. Green Man Hybrid

NEW! 75 Day. Broccoli. Loved by health food buffs as it is high in vitamins and nutrients, broccoli should be in every garden! A handsome garden variety, the dark green, tightly beaded heads are top quality and have a nice high dome shape. Weighing in at approximately 1 lb., it can be blanched and frozen or enjoyed fresh from the garden. As with all broccolis, it prefers cool weather so plant early and mulch soil to keep it cool and retain moisture.

They produced a generous amount of fruits to be used for all your fall decorating.



















♣ Greenfield

58-60 Day. Bush. 2018 Bean of the Year. Greenfield beans are long and sleek, reaching up to 7" in length. The glossy, dark-green color and firm texture holds up well to blanching. Very productive, a good choice for the home garden (you'll probably have extra to share). Plants are resistant to Common Bean Mosaic Virus (BCMV), Halo Blight, Rust and Anthracnose.

BUSH BEAN CULTURE

After all danger of frost, plant seed in rows 18-24" apart. Make furrows about 2" deep and space the beans 2" apart in the row. Cover with fine soil, firm the soil down but do not pack it too tightly over the seed. A packet of seed will plant approximately 20-30 feet of row. For best results, be certain to inoculate beans at time of planting with Nature's Aid Rhizobia Inoculant on page 2. Shipment of beans, peas, cowpeas, soybeans and any other legumes to the state of Idaho are to home gardeners only for personal use and cannot be resold for planting outside the original home garden.

* Accelerate

54 Day. Bush. PVP. 2013 Bean of The Year. This is a large sieve pod that is great for the home gardener. It was developed at the University of Wisconsin and was selected for its heavy yield and disease resistance. The medium-green pods are 6-7" in length and are borne evenly on the plant. Although it starts producing early, it remains productive throughout the whole season.
















POLE BEAN CULTURE

Plant 1" deep in hills 3' apart each way, 5 or 6 beans in a hill, then set 6' high rough poles into each hill. When plants are established, thin to 3 or 4 of the strongest plants in each hill. If you plant in rows, space seeds 4" apart in rows 2' apart and use our Trellis Netting for vine support (see page 7). Stake the netting every 3' to prevent sagging. Pick frequently, as pole beans are prolific and will continue to bear until frost.

◆ Blauhilde

55 Day. Pole. This purple-skinned, 9" bean turns dark green when cut and cooked. Flowers are purple and very attractive. Gorgeous in the garden.

♦ Kentucky Blue

FRENCH FILET BEAN HARVEST TIP

Classic French Filet beans usually have a string and must be harvested young; however, recent developments have eliminated the string in most varieties. For best flavor, harvest very young – under 1/4" thick, every two days.

♣ Borsalino

60 Day. Bush. French Filet. You won't miss any of these when you're picking! Round, straight, 4-5" beans turn an attractive bright yellow quickly and completely, making them easy to locate throughout the bushy plant. The heavy set of tender, tasty, stringless beans make them well suited for hand harvesting and home gardens. When grown in our test garden, Borsalino was a flavor favorite. Enjoy the crisp, incredible flavor fresh or lightly steamed.

Harvest shell beans when seeds are fully formed in the pod, but pods are still soft and green. Dry bean pods should be allowed to dry down until brown and brittle. Seeds sold are intended for planting and not for consumption. Color may vary depending on maturity.

GARLIC CULTURE

Garlic can be planted in either spring or fall. It is most commonly planted in the fall and should be lightly mulched in colder climates. Either way, separate bulbs into individual cloves and plant 3-5" apart in well-prepared, well-drained soil in a sunny location. Plant the cloves so that the tips are 2" beneath the surface.

Fall planted bulbs establish their roots early, allowing plants to grow faster. They reach their mature size the following summer. Garlic planted in the spring will need the full growing season and possibly a second year in the ground to reach its fully mature size. In extremely cold climates, spring planting is recommended.

After all danger of frost and when the soil temperature reaches 60°F, sow directly into the garden. Sow 6-8 seeds 1" deep in hills that are 6-8' apart (crowded vines will not yield well). Allow 12-14 days for germination. When plants are established, thin to 3-4 of the strongest plants. Aged manure mixed into the bottom of each hill helps stimulate growth. Excess nitrogen in summer induces vines to produce only male flowers. Female flowers make fruits.

STRAWBERRY CULTURE

Junebearing strawberries should have the blossoms removed the first year, and will then bear one large crop each season thereafter. Most reliable in zone 6 and colder, producing for 3 to 6 years with optimal care. Everbearing (EB) types will perform similarly to Junebearing types in colder climates, with one big crop per year, but can fruit the first year. In zone 7 and warmer EB types will produce crops reliably mid-season to late summer. EB plants should be replaced every other year in cold zones. Continually remove runners to encourage larger crowns, higher yields and larger berries. Our strawberries will arrive as dormant, bare root plants and are guaranteed healthy, disease-free, and dependable. Space plants 10-20" apart in rows 30" apart. Make sure the crown is at soil level and does not get buried. Thoroughly water plants until they are established.





CONTAINER GARDENING

With most of our population in urban areas, container and small space gardens are a solution for those looking to enjoy fresh produce. The items on this page have been bred specifically to maintain smaller plant sizes while still producing adequate yields of tasty, healthy vegetables. For best results we suggest using containers at least 24" wide, that are deep with good drainage holes. Fill containers with fresh, well-drained, pre-moistened potting soil. Watering must be monitored closely. Never let the soil dry completely, and avoid getting foliage wet when watering. Regular fertilization with veggie appropriate, water-soluble food (2-4-2) is necessary to keep plants well fed. Although these plants are compact, trellises and supports are recommended for some items and when fruit set is abundant.

Bean Mascotte

50 Day. Bush. 2014 AAS Winner. The bushy, compact, upright habit makes this bean ideal for growing in containers and small spaces. Plants only get 12-16" and produce long, slender, 5-6" pods that are held high on the plant. Bears all season long as long as you can keep up with picking!

Cucumber Patio Snacker Hybrid


