Share the Lenten Journey in March with us at Celebration Presbyterian Church

Lenten Worship -- The Church's worship during the season of Lent is simpler and more austere. *Alleluia* is not said or sung during Lenten worship. Lenten hymns are somewhat somber and meditative. The color purple is used in our paraments on the communion table and pulpit, which is both a sign of penitence and an expression of hope. All of these measures are meant to help us focus more intently on the spiritual disciplines to which the Church calls us in Lent: self-examination and repentance, prayer, fasting, self-denial, and reading and meditation on God's holy Word.

Other Lenten Disciplines — In this modern high-tech world we live in, some disciples find Lent to be a perfect time to take a "technology fast" by giving up their use of Facebook or Snapchat or the use of the internet or computers or tablets altogether. By unplugging/fasting from these technologies it frees up time for more prayer, Bible study, meditation and acts of service during Lent. I have offered two very positive disciplines to consider practicing during Lent. The first discipline is to view Lent as 40 Days of Praise and to be very intentional to offer daily praise to God for something worthwhile and praiseworthy that you experience in the course of each day. The second discipline is to make Lent 40 Days of Give-Aways and to be very intentional in your home to pare down your excess by setting aside items of clothing and housewares each day to give to someone in need who you know or to give them to a local charity like Salvation Army or Goodwill. These are just several ideas to consider as daily practices or disciplines during Lent.

Special Hymn Selection for Lent from the Glory to God Hymnal #851 Come, Bring Your Burdens to God. This hymn comes from South Africa. A great strength of music from southeastern Africa is that it usually emerges from communal life, and in singing such songs we unite our sung prayers with those of the people who created them. This hymn is based on the singing of the Mooiplaas congregation in South Africa. The English translation and music arrangement for this simple verse were done in 2008 by members of the Iona Community.

<u>Hymn Text:</u> Come, bring your burdens to God; come, bring your burdens to God; come, bring your burdens to God, for Jesus will never say no.

SESSION RETREAT PLANNING

2018 Session Priorities

- Session held a planning day on Saturday, February 3, to decide on the priorities for 2018. The group focused on the report last year based on the survey and small group meetings. Although additional tasks will be accomplished, the focused priorities developed in the group include:
- Visibility/Identity Church Sign Session is currently investigating costs for improving our sign, and types of improvements that could be incorporated.
- Church Property Session is having ongoing conversations with Presbytery and Horry County concerning the widening of Carolina Forest Blvd and the need to modify the entrance to our property. Session is also exploring options for a possible additional entrance on the western edge of the property and possible sharing with the County Recreation Center.
- **Church Directory** Session is exploring the possibility of a Church Directory. LifeTouch has been in touch with the church. We will need a planning committee and volunteers to schedule appointments for picture taking.
- **Stewardship** Session is working to help our congregation understand that stewardship includes time and talent as well as financial resources. We plan to communicate more often with the congregation with updates and information.
- Small Group Gatherings Session would like to encourage more interaction in small groups, both in the church and in the community. As an example, we are planning "God Gab", where a group of church members go into the community to have a prayer and share session. Currently the first is God Gab at the Grumpy Monk, where the community is invited to meet with us.
- **Volunteers** There is an ongoing need to encourage congregation members to share their talents. Session would like to recruit volunteers for various tasks. To highlight our many outreach activities, we are planning a Mission Sunday.
- **Identify Future Leaders** Tied in with other priorities, Session would like to identify potential future leaders in our church.
- Calendar of Events Session would like to develop an ongoing calendar of events so people can more easily plan to attend events. For example, we intend to have regular potlucks, movie nights, as well as other social events in the life of the church.
- **Publicity** We have so many wonderful events in our church life, and Session would like to more effectively publicize them to the community. For example, we want to better utilize our website, newsletter, Facebook, and other social media to get our message out. We also are looking for people who are interested in helping with publicity.
- **Fundraising** Session is planning fundraising events in the coming year.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

For month end February, I'm projecting a break even or slight net loss of approximately \$2,000 after all remaining expenses and income are posted for CPC and Preschool.

For February 1 through the 21, we have received \$10, 737 in pledges with one more Sunday to go. Our budget for pledges is \$12,500 per month. However, we have recently had several members who have had to lower their pledge amount due to personal financial reasons. The 2018 original pledge amount was \$145,055, but now stands at \$138,455.

Our congregation has always stepped up in time of need, but we need to also actively encourage people in our community to visit and join our wonderful church.

The Twelve Documents of the Book of Confessions

Elder Pettijohn continues discussion about our Book of Confessions. The Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (USA) consists of two parts: Part one is The Book of Confessions, which contains historical statements of what we as a church believe, and part two, the Book of Order, consists of the Foundations of Presbyterian Polity, Form of Government, Directory for Worship, and Rules of Discipline. Remember that to confess means to affirm, declare, acknowledge or take a stand for what one believes to be true. The Book of Confessions contains 12 documents. Two are ancient creeds: The Nicene Creed and the Apostles Creed. The Nicene Creed was produced by 2 councils, Nicaea in 325 and Constantinople in 381. It was an effort to unify all Christians and focused on the Trinity of God and Jesus and the Holy Spirit. The Apostles' Creed was developed over the early centuries and formed a universal statement of belief for Christians. Originally it was associated with baptism.

There are 4 confessions that represent 4 nations: Scots Confession (Scotland), Second Helvetic Confession (Switzerland), Westminster Confession of Faith (England), and Confession of 1967 (United States). Scots Confession was written in 1560 by a committee that included John Knox. It was the first Reformation confession, and was a protest of the Roman Catholic Church, and established the tenets of Protestantism. Written in 1561, the Second Helvetic Confession served as an authorative statement of faith by Reformed churches in Switzerland, Scotland, France, Germany. It tried to relate Scripture to everyday life and influenced English Puritans. The Westminster Confession of Faith, written in the 1640s, was an attempt to reform the Church of England (with the king as head of church) with a faithful interpretation of Scriptures. Its emphasis on practical living served as a model for Reformed churches in many countries. It was the main confession for American Presbyterians for many years. After 300 years the Confession of 1967 was developed to modernize the Presbyterian church in America. It resulted from the union of the United Presbyterian Church of North America and the Presbyterian Church in the USA in 1958. It also addressed the role of the church in society.

There are 3 catechisms: Heidelberg Catechism, Westminster Larger Catechism, and Westminster Shorter Catechism. A catechism is used for teaching. The Heidelberg Catechism was first adopted in 1563, and became doctrine for Reformed churches in Holland, Germany, and Hungary. Dutch explorers brought it to America in 1609. Written in 1647, the Shorter Westminster was designed to teach children about faith, and the Larger Catechism was originally designed for ministers to study in depth the faith of the church. They have questions and answers, for example from the Shorter Catechism: "Q1. What is the chief end of man? A. Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever." For many years, Presbyterian children had to memorize the 107 questions and answers.

There are two declarations. The Declaration of Barmen was written in 1934 as a clarification of the confessing churches of Germany against Nazism. The newest addition to the Book of Confessions was added to the Book of Order in 2016. It is a statement of belief against apartheid in particular, and stresses unity, reconciliation, and justice. It is especially relevant in discussing race relations.

The last document in the Book of Confessions is the Brief Statement of Faith, which resulted from the union of the Presbyterian Church in the United States and the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America in 1983. It is basically a modern summary of beliefs applied to today's church arranged in a trinitarian format with sections on God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit.
