PLANS ARE IN PLACE FOR PASTOR RENEWAL LEAVE MID-JUNE THROUGH END OF JULY

Mid-June marks a first for me and for Celebration Presbyterian Church. When I was called to serve Celebration back in the fall of 2011, the Pastor Nominating Committee, the Congregation through their vote to extend the call, the New Harmony Presbytery through their vote to concur with the call, and by my agreement to accept the call, all agreed to TERMS OF CALL that included PASTOR RENEWAL LEAVE after the seventh year of service. This summer 2019 I will be embarking on my first and the church's first, Pastor Renewal Leave from mid-June through the end of July.

You may be asking what is Pastor Renewal Leave? ...and I'm glad you asked!

This six-week time of renewal leave is intended to be time away for me from the church and my regular pastor routines and responsibilities of ministry here at Celebration. The purpose of such time away is to provide an intentional block of time for me as your pastor to seek Sabbath time with God and to listen and awaken to the movement of the Holy Spirit at this stage of my life and at this juncture in our shared ministry. To that end I will use my Pastoral Renewal Leave to practice many "Rs", such as: Rest – Renewal – Reading – Riding – Research – Rediscovery – Reunion – Relationships.

So in preparation for my Pastor Renewal Leave, I have a number of books set aside that I look forward to **reading** for enrichment and pleasure. I hope to **ride** to spend time with friends and family and enjoy the reunions and relationships. I will attend other churches for worship as well as **research** into how their worship compares/contrasts to our worship at Celebration and what I might glean from them that may be worth sharing in the worship life of Celebration. As for **rediscovery**, I will be spending time with God, glorifying God and enjoying God, and seeking rediscovery of God's love for me and God's ongoing plans for my life as a Christ Follower who is still seeking to grow in grace and service. I also hope to have some extra rest and unstructured days where naps can happen and dreams affirm the true depth of restful and renewing sleep.

During my Pastor Renewal Leave, the Celebration Session will be providing for worship leadership, administration oversight, pastoral care and ministry programs. I am deeply grateful for the support and creativity of the Session in working to facilitate my Pastor Renewal Leave this summer. I also want to express my deep appreciation to the membership of Celebration and New Harmony Presbytery for valuing and supporting TERMS OF CALL for pastors like me, that include such times of Pastor Renewal Leave. The intention is to help pastors be healthier and more rested and renewed so that he/she can avoid (or recover from) pastoral burn-out and feel supported and sustained and reinvigorated for many more years of ministry and service.

I will hold each of you in my heart and in my prayers during my time away from Celebration this summer and I request your ongoing prayers for Celebration, for me and my family too. Thanks be to GOD who breathes life and new life into each of us — and who sustains us and renews us for fulfilling our ongoing call to follow and serve Christ in the Church and in the world.

THE GOD-POWERED CHURCH

The God-Powered Church, by Joan Gray, Online Re Elders, Presbyterian Website Suggested by Terry Pettijohn

The Church of Jesus Christ was created from the beginning to be **God-powered**. On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, who were then empowered to be God's hands and feet and mouths to the world. What about our churches today? Where does our power come from? Below are some characteristics of God-powered churches. Read them prayerfully and think about how you see your church exhibiting these characteristics.



God-powered churches experience church as a divine-human partnership. This is the way Jesus intended the church, his body, to operate. In this partnership what we do is important. What God does is essential. God's will for us unfolds as we are drawn into this partnership.

God-powered churches <u>make nurturing relationships with God a top priority.</u> All deep relationships involve paying attention to the other. Our commitment to this God-relationship requires that we invest ourselves in practices, postures, habits, etc., that build the relationship.

God-powered churches are equipped by the Holy Spirit. We are not capable of being the Body of Christ for the world without the empowering work of the Holy Spirit. With the Spirit, all things are possible.

God-powered churches <u>live by prayer.</u> Prayer gives the Holy Spirit "place and space" to work in our lives. We will never fully understand prayer but practicing it obediently and faithfully opens the way for God to do more than we could ever ask or imagine.

God-powered churches are shaped and guided by engagement with Scripture. Engagement with God's word is necessary to do God's work. God-powered churches open up creative space so that people can hear God's voice speaking personally to them through Scripture.

God-powered churches <u>require spiritual leaders.</u> Spiritual leaders are passionate about God and live toward the goal of having God firmly seated at the center of their lives and of their church. These leaders have a lively relationship with a God who is always doing a new thing.

God-powered churches <u>take spiritual realities and resources seriously.</u> In the God-powered church as people pray and act in faith, God draws the resources to do what God wants to be done. The God who calls is the God who provides.

God-powered churches <u>live to serve.</u> Church exists to do God's will by the power of the Spirit out in the world as well as inside the church. God's mission is the reason for their existence and the focus of their energies.

God-powered churches are places of transformation. Living close to Jesus through the Holy Spirit changes us. It has a transforming impact not only on individuals, but also on families, churches, communities, and the world.

God-powered churches <u>teach and practice discernment.</u> Decisions shape our common life, and HOW we decide things is important. God-powered congregations discover that coming to decisions through seeking God's will shapes them into being more Godly in their lives and mission.

RAINBOW CONNECTION FUNDRAISER

The Session of Celebration Presbyterian Church is pleased to announce the Rainbow Connection Fundraiser that will take place during the month of June.

When Noah emerged from the ark after the great flood, God took the rainbow, and consecrated it as the sign of his love and the witness of his promise. The rainbow is a symbol of God's faithfulness and mercy. The "rainbow around the throne," (Revelation 4:3) is seen as the symbol of hope and the bright emblem of mercy and love. Rainbows are all the more true as a symbol of hope because they are reflected from the aftermath of the storm. The rainbow seems a fitting example for us to contemplate when we consider the current needs of Celebration Church.

While our church is precious to us, we must remember that our spiritual lives and the mission of the church in the world are not carried out by accident. They depend on everyone who is part of our community of faith.

And that means we give of ourselves freely. The practice of Christian stewardship leads us to employ our "time, talent and treasure" in God's service, so that we can care for and build up the church for the sake of the world God loves.

With the rainbow in mind, we ask that you consider the following current needs of the church:

- 1-Repair The church, while not destroyed by the flood, did sustain damage to the steeple during Hurricane Florence. Funds are needed to repair the steeple.
- 2-Enhance -The congregation identified the desire to install a lighted cross on the outside of our building.
- 3-Sustain -Ongoing operating funds are always needed during summer months.

On the bulletin board you will see a rainbow made up of envelopes with different denominations of gifts. Please take an envelope as your heart leads you and donate to the Rainbow Connection Fundraiser during the month of June so that we may have the funds to repair, enhance, and sustain our church property.
