"May" We Enjoy the Pleasure of Your Presence With Us in Worship and Fellowship and Service at Celebration Presbyterian Church during <u>MAY</u> 2019?

APRIL SHOWERS...BRING MAY FLOWERS...AND MUCH, MUCH MORE...

Thoughts of MAY have lyrics of a beloved hymn running through my mind so I want to share them.

ALL THINGS BRIGHT AND BEAUTIFUL (Hymn No. 20 in our Glory to God hymnal)

Refrain: All things bright and beautiful, all creatures great and small, all things wise and wonderful, the Lord God made them all.

- 1 Each little flower that opens, each little bird that sings, God made their glowing colors, God made their tiny wings. [Refrain]
- 2 The purple-headed mountain, the river running by, the sunset, and the morning that brightens up the sky: [Refrain]
- 3 The cold wind in the winter, the pleasant summer sun, the ripe fruits in the garden, God made them every one. [Refrain]
- 4 God gave us eyes to see them, and lips that we might tell how great is God Almighty, who has made all things well. [Refrain]

In his book on hymns, **Albert Bailey** writes of this particular one, "For once Mrs. Alexander has forgotten her theology and lost herself in the beauty of nature" (*The Gospel in Hymns*, 354). Many of us, if not all, have had these moments. Whether we're in a park, on a mountain, at the sea or a lake, or simply driving down the highway with a glorious sunset behind us, it is not difficult to find ourselves lost in the beauty of God's creation. These scenes should bring to mind Genesis 1:31: "And God saw all that he had made, and it was very good." Albert Bailey is perhaps mistaken when he claims that Alexander forgot her theology in the writing of these verses. For when we are in the midst of God's creation, are our ideas of who God is not being shaped by all that we see? God made a good creation, and God loves it. Our God is a good God, who gives us good things, and then tasks us with taking care of them. Our God is imaginative, and God's creation is both whimsical and sometimes startlingly majestic. Let us lift our voices in praise to our maker, the creator of all things bright and beautiful.





A BRIEF STATEMENT OF FAITH

This month we discuss A Brief Statement of Faith found in the Presbyterian Church USA Book of Order. Suggested by Elder Terry Pettijohn

A Brief Statement of Faith

In 1983, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) was formed by the reunion of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America (the "northern" branch) and the Presbyterian Church in the United States (the "southern" branch). Integral to reunion was the preparation of a brief statement of faith. While recognizing realities of diversity and disagreement in both the church and the world, members of the drafting committee sought to articulate Presbyterians' common identity.

Early in its discussions, the committee decided to write a statement of faith that could be used in worship. The committee drew extensively on the documents in the Book of Confessions and on Scripture for its formulations and arranged them within a trinitarian framework. The three major sections begin with "We trust in Jesus Christ", "We trust in God", and "We trust in God the Holy Spirit".

The Brief Statement of Faith is distinctive in several respects. Unlike the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds, which move directly from Jesus' birth to his death, the statement emphasizes the significance of Jesus' ministry in Judea and Galilee.

The Brief Statement of Faith emphasizes gender-inclusiveness. It underscores the role of both men and women in God's covenant, uses feminine as well as masculine imagery of God, and affirms ordination of both women and men. The statement also expresses concern for the integrity of God's creation.

Affirming at its beginning that "In life and death we belong to God" (11.1, line 1) and, at its end, that "nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord," (11.05, lines 78, 79) the Brief Statement of Faith concludes liturgically with the church's familiar doxology of praise and thanksgiving.
