#### **God You Spin the Whirling Planets**

(Hymn #23 in our new *Glory to God* Hymnal)

In 1978 Jane Parker Huber wrote this wonderful hymn for the 1979 National Meeting of United Presbyterian Women, whose theme, "In the Image of God," is variously considered here as reflection, focus, distortion, and polishing for clarity.

Recently in worship we have focused on the mystery of our Triune God who is revealed to us in creative, redemptive and sustaining ways. Please read the text of the hymn and ponder what it means for us to bear God's image to the world and to reveal Christ everywhere and to everyone. <a href="Verse one: God">Verse one: God</a>, You spin the whirling planets, fill the seas and spread the plain. Mold the mountains, fashion blossoms, Call forth sunshine, wind and rain. We created in Your image, would a true reflection be. Of Your justice, grace and mercy and the truth that makes us free. <a href="Verse two: You have called us to be faithful in our life and ministry">Verse two: You have called us to be faithful in our life and ministry. We respond in grateful worship, joined in one community. When we blur Your gracious image, focus us and make us whole. Healed and strengthened as Your people, we move onward toward Your goal. <a href="Verse three: God">Verse three: God</a>, Your word is still creating, calling us to life made new. Now reveal to us fresh vistas where there's work to dare and do. Keep us clear of all distortion. Polish us with loving care. Thus new creatures in Your image, we'll proclaim Christ everywhere.

Jane Parker Huber uses vivid imagery to describe the interplay of our lives reflecting God's image as we live out God's calling. The third verse has great application for us today. God does call each of us to new life and provides us with fresh views of where God would have us serve, bringing glory to God's kingdom. With God's help, we can stay focused while God polishes off our rough edges so that we might serve God more gloriously by proclaiming Christ everywhere.

Are there places in your life where you would be uncomfortable bearing God's image or revealing Christ to others? How might God be polishing your rough edges to better reveal God's image within you?

In closing let me share that June 15, 2016 marks the thirtieth anniversary of my Ordination to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church USA. Over the past thirty years of ministry and mission I have witnessed God's creativity in opening *new vistas where there is work to dare and do*. It was just such a creative call of God in 2011 that led me to this new vista where there is work to dare and do. I count myself truly blessed to be sharing the Christian journey with you here at Celebration Presbyterian Church and look forward the unfolding mission and ministry opportunities God has in store for us in the years to come!

### SESSION UPDATE

Following are the items the Session discussed:

- Blessing of the Bikes was a success. One biker inquired about being baptized. Forty-five Bikers and ten Church Members attended.
- Elder Coulter distributed reports to each committee with their spending to date compared to the budget. So far this year, we are on track with the budget.
- The group reviewed the Preschool budget recommendation for the 2016 -2017 school year. A motion passed to defer approving the budget until the audit is completed and the Personnel Committee has an opportunity to meet and review compensation recommendations.
- The Mission and Outreach Committee is working on participating in the United Way Day of Caring in the fall. Church and charitable groups will gather on September 11 and go out into the community and perform various types of service projects.
- Youth from the church will be attending Camp Pee Dee and Mountain Adventure Camp in Bryson, NC. On June 5, there will be a blessing and sending of the campers during worship.
- Tickets are still available for a special Pelican's baseball game "Faith and Family Night" on June 26.
- The church-owned riding lawn mower has been successfully repaired and is back in operation. We are blessed to have volunteers who are cutting the grass, thus saving the church the cost

of paying an outside contractor.

- The Personnel Committee is working on employee evaluations for the staff.
- The framing around our new entry door will be completed at the end of the Preschool year.
- Gary Forrester from Clemson Extension met with the Community Gardening group. Discussions are ongoing to create a demonstration bed as a beginning to a community garden.
- The Worship Committee is modifying the procedures for distributing communion and collecting the offering, so don't be alarmed if ushers follow a different path. Anyone who is an usher or is serving communion will be trained in the new procedures.
- The Choir will take a break from

- Pastor Becky held an organizational meeting for the widows and widowers of the church in hopes of establishing a support/social group.
- For Generative Time, the Session discussed a wonderful resource from our Presbytery "Seeking to be Faithful Together". The Session is committed to the guidelines provided on listening to one another, having peaceful discussions, and loving each other through times when we agree and times when we don't. It is a true blessing to be able to build Christ's kingdom with a Session committed to love and grace!

572 labels have been turned into to **Thornwell Home for Children**. These labels equal \$57.20 that can used for music lessons, musical instruments, laptops, and other extras. You don't have to spend any extra money to get these labels; they are found on products you use every day. Last year, Thornwell raised over \$6,000 with these labels.

When you have a label, such as a Campbell Soup label, you have to have the complete label that includes the complete bar code and the number of points.

So the next time you are cooking, cleaning or sneezing, check your box to see if there is a label and cut it out and bring it to church. There is a baggie on the bulletin board where you can place your labels.

There is now a permanent IRS rule that you may allocate part of your IRA distribution directly to the church or any other qualifying non-profit. If you are currently making a monthly withdrawal from your IRA you need to talk to your plan administrator about setting that up.

This distribution can be made even if you are not itemizing deductions. It becomes a non-taxable withdrawal direct to the recipient and therefore reduces your AGI on your tax return. This in turn can reduce the amount of Social Security that becomes taxable, and reduce your income taxes.

There are several ways this can be done: through a direct transfer to the church's account, by wire transfer or check payable directly to the church.

Please consider this option. Be sure to discuss this with your fund manager.
