Recently, I had the privilege of sharing in worship leadership with my Dad at First Presbyterian Church in Maxton, North Carolina, where he has been serving for thirteen years in retirement as Pastoral Supply. The church had organized a Pastor Appreciation Sunday in honor of my Dad and they invited me to come be the guest preacher in worship. Let me assure you that the weekly task of prayer and preparation for preaching for each and every Sunday is an awesome responsibility but it was an even more weighty matter for me to prepare a special message to honor God and my earthly father on this special appreciation day. The lectionary passage from John 10 focused on the ministry of Jesus the Good Shepherd and it was a passage that allowed me to have some wonderful interplay between Jesus the Good Shepherd and my Dad, who has be following and serving the Good Shepherd as an ordained Presbyterian Pastor for sixty years. Early in my life and in my relationship with Dad our different talents and interests made our relationship strained. It seemed that we lacked common hobbies and interests to share. But, since my call to ministry back in 1979, Dad and I have found that ministry has become a common bond and shared vocation for us. Little could I understand as a child that the very context of Dad's ministry in our church, community, home and family life was subtly and steadily equipping me by his life's example to follow the WAY OF CHRIST as a minister of word and sacrament. I am grateful to God for giving me this common bond of ministry with my Dad. I love my Dad and can appreciate him more and more the longer I live and serve the Church by following the GOOD SHEPHERD. I am also grateful to the loving congregation of FPC Maxton for sharing in ministry with my Dad for many years. At the heart of what I've learned about ministry from my Dad are love and acceptance for ALL GOD'S CHILDREN, make room at the table for strangers and misfits, and always welcome your children home with loving arms. I am blessed to be a part of a long family line and tradition of Presbyterian Ministers and ministry and I THANK GOD for ALL my nuclear family and church family members who have shared in the education, nurture, care and love for me in ministry! I say, "HOW GOOD OF GOD!"

Core Beliefs of Presbyterians (USA)

Jesus is Lord - "All power, truth, and salvation rest with God alone. [Source: 1 Cor. 12:3]

The Trinity - "We believe in the one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Trinity is not an optional "extra" to God; it is the very nature of God as revealed to us in Scripture." [Source: Matthew 28:19]

The Nature of God - "The good news of the Gospel is that the triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—creates, redeems, sustains, rules, and transforms all things and all people." [Source: Book of Order, F-1.01]

The Person of Jesus Christ- "Jesus Christ is the only savior of the world, and the true awaited Messiah." [Sources: Acts 16:1]

Salvation - "Jesus Christ is the only Savior and Lord, and all people everywhere are called to place their faith, hope, and love in him." [Sources: Ephesians 1:3-14]

Sacraments - We celebrate two sacraments—baptism and the Lord's Supper—because these are uniquely instituted by Christ. [Sources: Matthew 28:19; Luke 22:19-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23]

Scripture - "The one sufficient revelation of God is Jesus Christ, the Word of God incarnate, to whom the Holy Spirit bears unique and authoritative witness through the Holy Scriptures." [Sources: John 1:1-18 and 21:24-25; Book of Confessions, 9.27]

The Church - "Christ Jesus is the only Head of the Kirk [Church], even as it is the body and spouse of Christ Jesus." [Sources: Ephesians 4:15; Book of Confessions, 3.16]

Ordination - "All ordained leaders in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) publicly affirm that Jesus Christ is Savior and acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church." [Sources: 1 Timothy 3:1-13; Book of Order, W-4.4003a]

Evangelism - "God sends the church in the power of the Holy Spirit . . . to tell all nations and peoples of Christ's call to repentance, faith, and obedience." [Sources: Matthew 28:16-20]
