### SESSION UPDATE

The Session met for their monthly stated meeting on August 23. Following are actions and activities of your session:

The Session reflected on the loss of beloved Elder, Sally Herstine. She was remembered for her tireless work in the area of Missions. Sally was a founding volunteer at Shepherd's Table, and a long time supporter of SOS Healthcare, and Helping Hand. She organized the Santa's Sneakers drive and added a sock drive just this past month. A memorial service is planned for September 6 at 4:00pm at Celebration. Volunteers are needed to provide food for the reception and support in setting up the church. Email the church office to volunteer.

Entertainment coupon books are available for 2016 for a cost of \$20 and can be used starting now.

The Personnel Committee is continuing to work on annual evaluations for church staff.

A Leadership Forum was held on August 5 and all ordained elders, deacons, and clergy from the congregation were invited to an evening of fellowship and discussion about plans for Celebration. A presentation by Pastor Tom highlighted the Session's commitment to prayer for God's direction, and all were invited to join the effort. The group was also invited to join the Session in reading "Sailboat Church: Helping Your Church Rethink Its Mission and Practice" by Joan S. Gray. The book suggests that there

are two kinds of churches: Sailboat Churches and Rowboat Churches. What are the qualities of Sail Boat churches? Leaders know that what they have or lack in the way of human and material resources is not the decisive factor in what they can accomplish... They look at church as a continuing adventure with a God who leads and empowers them to do more than they ever could have dreamed. The key question is not "What do we have?", but "What is God leading us to be and do now in the place where we find ourselves?" They believe that the God who calls is the God who provides, and that if they are invested in doing what God wants the church to do, God will provide the resources. With the Holy Spirit in their sails, away they go! What are the qualities of Rowboat churches? God has given the church a basic agenda and then left it up to the church to get on with it. Progress depends on circumstances like the amount of money in the bank, the number of volunteers available, the charisma and skill of its leaders, and the demographics of its community. They ask the question, "What can we do with what we have?" Presence or absence of resources largely determines what can be done. What the sea is like and how willing and able people are to ROW makes the decisions. Let's Sail on together! **Books are** available to "check out" for anyone interested in reading with us.
