PASTOR'S ARTICLE

September is Stewardship Emphasis Month at Celebration Our Stewardship Theme is "God's Generosity and Ours"

Ephesians 1:3-14 - ³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. ⁵He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ⁶to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ⁷In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ⁸that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight ⁹he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ¹⁰as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. ¹¹In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹²so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

In the opening of Paul's letter to the Christians in Ephesus, he shares a beatitude (a blessing) expressing the manifold blessings God has generously given us in Jesus Christ. In the Greek this is just one long sentence that outlines the gift of redemption and eternal life that God has blessed us with. Paul describes our adoption as God's own children and the forgiveness of our sins that God has graciously lavished on us through Jesus Christ. Paul even describes how God has sealed each of us with the Holy Spirit as a pledge (from God to us) of our inheritance as God's own people among the redeemed of God. All of this generous outpouring from God inspires us to live for the PRAISE OF GOD'S GLORY! We have life in all its fullness by the generosity of God who loves us and calls us to live our lives worshipping and praising God and following Jesus Christ in fulfilling God's will in our daily living and serving.

Friends, God's Generosity is demonstrated to us day by day. We see it in the wonders of nature, the provisions of our daily bread, the forgiveness of our sins, and in the call to let our lives reflect God's love in our words, our deeds and in our own patterns of giving. May God inspire us in gratitude and trust to grow and extend our own generosity in how we give and how we live and serve our neighbors. It takes each of us joining together in generosity to support and extend the mission and ministry of Celebration Presbyterian Church. Our motivation to live and give generously is not fear or compulsion but God's own demonstration of generosity (as described above by the Apostle Paul) that inspires our gratitude and desire to glorify God by giving our lives fully to God's work in the world today.


