HYMN OF THE MONTH - For September I have another favorite hymn of mine to share. *God of Grace and God of Glory* is number 307 in our GLORY TO GOD hymnal. Harry Emerson Fosdick (1878-1969) is the author and it was first published in the *Praise and Service: Hymns with Tunes for Christian Worship*, ed, H. Augustine Smith (New York, 1932). As an exercise "to see whether or not it was possible for [him] to express some of [his] attitudes in singable hymns," Harry Emerson Fosdick wrote several of them while summering on Mouse Island in Boothbay Harbor off the coast of Maine in 1930. This text was among them, and it "turned out to be a hymn that was adaptable for the dedication service of the Riverside Church [February 8, 1931], and it was so used." Especially when considered in the context of that magnificent New York City edifice, this hymn is a stirring reminder that "church" primarily denotes people and only secondarily a building.

## SESSION UPDATE

The Session of Celebration met on Thursday, August 24, 2017 and offer the following report

- We approved the Consent Agenda which included minutes of our July 16 Stated Meeting, the Financial Reports for July 31, and the Monthly Presbytery Support (\$2,000) request for August 2017.
- Received reports from the Evangelism Committee that celebrated 27 participants at the recent movie night that featured THE SHACK, and outreach to new families at the Carolina Forest Elementary School open house on August 17.
- Received Financial updates through July and learned that giving has been down through the summer but this is traditionally the pattern.
   Preschool tuition will resume shortly and worship attendance and weekly giving will be on the rise as folks return from summer travels.
- Stewardship emphasis will have a special focus during September and October culminating in our Stewardship Commitment Sunday
  which is scheduled for Sunday, October 29. Thanks to everyone for your generous support of Celebration and for staying current in your
  giving.
- We received a report on Adult Education that Sunday Adult Bible Study will resume Sunday, September 10, at 9:15am and continue with the study of the Gospel of Matthew.
- We received a report on Christian Education for children and learned that VBS went extremely well and we averaged 46 children per night. Thanks to everyone who volunteered and helped make VBS 2017 a SUPER HERO SUCCESS.
- We received a report on Christian Education for our youth and learned that they will once again host sales for the Belk Charity Day
  discount coupons as a fund raiser for youth events through the year. We also heard a report on our youth who attended summer camp
  and one who worked as a camp counselor and had a very life-changing experience. Thanks to everyone who helped support our youth
  attending summer camp.
- The Hospitality report included notice of the Pasta With the Pastor Luncheon for Newcomers and Inquirers will be held on Sunday, September 10, following morning worship. Anyone interested in learning more about Celebration and how to become a member or just more involved, are welcome to RSVP by Wednesday, September 6, by calling Linda Berry in the church office at 843-903-0308. Hospitality is also planning for the hosting of The New Harmony Presbytery Meeting on Tuesday, October 10. This will involve feeding all the presbyters a boxed lunch and food prep ahead of time for those lunches and snacks to be served during registration. Please offer to help because we will need many volunteers to share in the hosting of this big day. Thanks. Hospitality will provide food for the upcoming Red Cross Blood Drive at Celebration on Wednesday, November 1, from 3-7:30pm.
- Property Committee reported that ALL lighting in the church has been changed to LED lighting and Rick Thornburgh will be meeting with Santee Cooper representatives to process the necessary rebates offered for making this energy saving investment. The Session wishes to THANK Mike Guarino (friend of Nancy Resnick) for sharing his expertise, LED bulbs and helping with the installation. There will be a church-wide work day on Saturday, September 23 (RAIN DATE Saturday, September 30). We will be cleaning up the grounds, garden and facilities in preparation for hosting the Presbytery meeting on October 10. Please brings yard tools, gloves and a cheery disposition and join us for WORK DAY beginning at 9:00am.
- Worship committee reported that Sarah Abushakra will be seeking some additional Coastal Carolina Music students to be stipend-supported singers with our choir. This has proven to be a wonderful experience with Chris Wright who is sadly having to give up his regular involvement with our choir due to senior year responsibilities at Coastal.
- Endowment Committee reported that the current balance of the Endowment Fund is \$28,652.00. The Committee encourages everyone to consider a gift to the Endowment Fund in support of our future at Celebration.
- Communication and Technology reported that elders are helping with promotional videos for the many areas of our ministry and mission. These will be used on our website and some in worship as minutes for mission. A TV monitor is now mounted in the hallway (THANKS PROPERTY COM) it and will be used to visually promote church and preschool activities. If you have an event to promote please contact the church office or Cecilia Evans to ask about having a slide created to promote the upcoming event. SPECIAL THANKS to Celebration member *Charles Schmidt* for donating the TV Monitor, to Tom Dendy and Rick Thornburgh for installing the wall bracket, and to electrician and preschool parent, *Steve Favreau* for installing the electrical outlet needed to power the TV monitor.
- Beginning Sunday, September 10, Terri Pettijohn and others involved with the Strategic Planning Committee will begin sharing the outcomes and vision gained from our recent Congregational Survey and the overall Ministry and Mission Planning Process report.
- Pastor Becky Kiser gave notice of ending her Temporary Supply ministry relationship with Celebration in early September. Beginning
  September 10, she will be serving as Interim Pastor of the Indiantown Presbyterian Church in Hemingway, SC. The Session expressed
  deep appreciation to Becky for her leadership in worship, help with pastoral care and for initiating and teaching the Tool Time Bible
  Study. Pastor Tom asked that we share a special time of Appreciation, Blessing and Sending for Pastor Becky in worship on September 3.
- Received a written report from the Preschool Board and acknowledge that Bernie Pettijohn has agreed to Chair the Preschool Board for the 2017-18 school year.
- Received a verbal report from the Nominations Committee that they will have a first meeting Sunday, August 27, to orient members and prayerfully begin their work. *(continued on Page 4)*

Almost every line is a prayer for the congregation; there is no celebration of the structure or its ornaments. As a result, this text has proved usable by a wide range of congregations gathered in any sort of building (or none). Because of the broad sound and corporate focus of this hymn, it serves better as an opening or closing selection than at other points in the service. Since it is essentially a prayer that the assembly who sings it may be empowered by the outpouring of God's Spirit, it makes a fitting and moving final hymn for a service.

July income showed a loss of \$7,196 while YTD there is a loss of \$19, 919. These losses have been covered by a transfer from our savings account. CPC's first Summer Camp ended in July with income generated of \$8,580, and expenses of \$9,022 for a loss of \$442. There should be some improvement in our financial condition as we enter into the fall.

This month Elder Pettijohn reports on a brief history of the Apostle's Creed. The constitution of the Presbyterian Church USA has two parts, the Book of Order and the Book of Confessions. We will cover many of the confessions in future newsletters, but we start with the first one, the Apostle's Creed.

#### The History of the Apostle's Creed

The Christian church went from Jerusalem into Judea and to the end of the earth (Acts 1:8). It had many obstacles to overcome. It had to take the Jewish gospel into Greek and Roman society. The church had to develop strategies for worship, education, administration, evangelism, and social action. It had to compete with other religions.

Early creeds helped to define the mission of the church. The Apostle's Creed is the earliest, most rugged, and best known of the documents that make up the creeds and confessions of the Presbyterian church. It was first formulated in Rome between 160 and 180 AD.

At that time a man by the name of Marcion arrived in Rome, intent on forcing the Christian church to accept his ideas. Marcion did not believe God was the creator, since why would a creator create snakes and make life so miserable? He tried to erase from scripture all Jewish ideas, and said the only scripture necessary was Paul's letters.

The Apostle's Creed was developed partly as a response to Marcion. The original was brief: I believe in God, the all-sovereign Father. And In Jesus Christ, His Son, the One born of Mary the Virgin, the One crucified under Pontius Pilate, and buried; the third day risen from the dead, ascended into the heavens, seated at the right hand of the Father, whence He will come to judge the living and the dead. And in the Holy Ghost, resurrection of flesh.

The Apostle's Creed's structure may be based on Jesus' command to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Most early Christians were illiterate, so oral repetition of the Apostles' Creed, along with the Lord's Prayer and the Ten Commandments helped to preserve and transmit the Christian faith.

The Trinity was emphasized. When baptized, people stated their faith, "I baptize thee in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." When baptized, on the night before Easter in 180 AD, they repeated the Apostle's Creed, and then they celebrated Lord's Supper on Easter.

Between 150 and 300 AD, the Church experienced major persecution, often requiring Christians to make sacrifices to the emperor at Rome (place incense on an alter to the emperor). If Christians refused, they were tortured or killed. When the persecutions ended, a debate arose as to who should come to church services, only the true ones or also the ones who were weak. It was decided that everyone should be welcome, and the phrase was added to the Apostle's Creed: *I believe in the forgiveness of sins*.

Another controversy arose in the early 5th century in North Africa when Augustine was the bishop of Hippo. How universal was the church? Some argued only those who were faithful in Rome, others argued all Christians. Augustine insisted it should be everyone. Eventually the phrase was added: *I believe in the Holy catholic Church*. 'Holy' refers to morally firm, and 'catholic' refers to universal.

Two other phrases were added in 5th century. He descended into hell was added in Gaul, referring to the Lord entering the region of darkness upon His death and bringing the light of life there. The communion of saints was included to describe the constituency of the church: the 'saint' is one who has been sanctified by the death and resurrection of Christ. The Church is a community of those who have been set apart by the call of God in Christ to share fully in the life of faith. The Apostle's Creed was completed in its present form in the 8th century.

The Apostle's Creed states our faith in the triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It teaches about Christ by a series of verbs: was conceived, born, suffered, crucified, dead, buried, rose again, ascended, will come to judge. Communion of saints is an antidote to life's isolations and alienations. We receive forgiveness of our sins. We are promised resurrection of the body, and life eternal.
