

## WRAPPING UP THE SCHOOL YEAR

<ul><li>SUBMIT FINAL GRADES.</li><li>Jot down a quick sentence about each student's progress in the past year.</li></ul>
<ul> <li>HONOR STUDENTS FOR THEIR ACCOMPLISHMENTS.</li> <li>This may include awards, speeches, gifts, letters, or any special celebrations.</li> <li>Consider writing students special letters about their academic and character strengths.</li> <li>Know the expectations for school award ceremonies.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>REFLECT ON YOUR CLASS'S ACHIEVEMENTS AND WHAT STUDENTS LEARNED.</li> <li>Ask students about their favorite activities, their most challenging tasks, and how they feel they have grown.</li> <li>Countdown to the last day with a fun activity each day—having a special snack, extra recess, or bringing in an item from home. Make it fun!</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>PLAN TIME TO CLEAN THE CLASSROOM WITH STUDENTS.</li> <li>Students may enjoy helping by wiping down desks and furniture and sorting through books and supplies.</li> <li>Leave student work on the walls until the very last day—otherwise, students become very aware that the year is over!</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>SEND STUDENT SUPPLIES HOME.</li> <li>Send home crayons, folders, pencils, erasers, scissors, notebooks, etc.</li> <li>Save a handful of the most popular color crayons, markers, and glue sticks for next year.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>SET ASIDE TIME TO TACKLE AREAS ONLY YOU CAN CLEAN.</li> <li>Clean and organize cabinets, supplies, and your desk.</li> <li>Determine what you can recycle or give away to other staff.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>BREAK DOWN THE CLASSROOM.</li> <li>Cover bookshelves or move books, stack items on counters, and put up decorations you don' want to be moved.</li> <li>Take home items of value such as microwaves, mini-fridges, or coffee pots.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>ON THE LAST DAY, TAKE TIME TO THINK.</li> <li>Think about what you liked and didn't like about your year, what worked and what didn't, and how you want to set up your classroom the following year.</li> <li>List new supplies you may need to buy.</li> <li>Take home professional development resources and your teaching badge, and create a list of your computer login passwords so you don't forget!</li> </ul>
