The Title

Important Statements That Characters Make

Symbols	
A <b>symbol</b> is a recurring image, description, or idea that stands for something beyond itself. Symbols can emphasize theme.

  - Simile: a comparison between two things that uses the word like or as
  - **Metaphor:** a comparison between two things that does not use the word *like* or *as*
  - Personification: describing something non-human in human terms
  - **Hyberbole:** an exaggeration for emphasis
