Read Jeremiah 10:3-6; Isaiah 46:9b; Isaiah 44:6, then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Children's Worship, the kids are learning that God will always be God, and nothing can ever take His place. What a comforting and essential truth for children to hear! Fortunately, this truth is not just for our children, but it is for you and me.

As we read Jeremiah 10:3-6, we can see the hope the Israelites put in their man-made idols.

Although our culture tends not to promote making an idol out of wood and bowing down to it in our living rooms, our hearts can be just as wayward. In your lesson this week, you will discuss with the children common things people try to put before God.
