

God is Eternal

Read Psalm 90:1-2, 93, Deuteronomy 33:27a, then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Children's Worship, the children will learn that God has no beginning or end. The God who created the world and led the Israelites out of Egypt is the same God who knows the number of hairs on your head. As our finite human minds try to comprehend this characteristic of God, there is nothing we can do but respond in worship.

Scripture teaches us that God is eternally sovereign and has no end. Nothing or no one can thwart His plans! In Psalm 93, the psalmist concludes that God's everlasting nature (vs. 2) results in His trustworthiness (vs. 5).

- How does the knowledge of God's eternal existence help you trust Him?

- This week, what relationship, circumstance, or decision do you need to choose to trust God with?

In Deuteronomy 33:27, God is described as a "dwelling place."

- What does it mean for God to be your dwelling place? How have you sat in His presence this week?

Throughout Scripture, every reference to God as everlasting is done so in a framework of worship. When we consider the infinite nature of God there is nothing we can do but be in awe of Him.

- Please take a moment to ponder God's incredible nature and write out a response prayer of praise. Just like the psalmists, praise Him for His trustworthiness, His incredible nature, and for all He has done in your life.
