

Incomprehensible

Read Romans 8:31-39; Job 38:1-15, then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Children's Worship, the kids will learn that God is *incomprehensible*. What a comfort and joy it is to know that we serve a God who is far greater than all we could ask or imagine. That means He is greater than our fears, anxieties, or hardships, and He loves His children with a perfect love. Talk about having a boost of confidence as we face the many trials of this life knowing our incomprehensible God is going before us!

Job 37-39 is an incredible account of God's work and majesty in creation.

- How does this passage teach us of the incomprehensible nature of God?

- In what ways do you see the greatness of God in creation?

If God is incomprehensible, that means there is always something new you can learn about God.

- What is something *new* you learned about God this week whether through Scripture, an experience, or a relationship?

- What kind of response did you feel when you learned this? Were you surprised, comforted, amazed, etc?

In Romans 8, Paul describes the incredible love and protection of God.

- How does reading this passage give you peace as you face each new day?

Let's pray:

Father, when we take the time to ponder the vastness of who You are it is too much for us to understand. We will never fully understand the nature of who You are and what You have accomplished, but we thank you for constantly revealing more of Yourself to us. Please help us to know you more every day.
