

Got Questions?

Read Isaiah 46:9b, and Deuteronomy 6:4-5, then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Children's Worship, the kids will learn that it is OK to ask questions about God! In fact, our lesson this week teaches that we *should* ask questions in order to learn about who God is, and what He has done. If you have spent any time teaching kids previous to this week, then you know this news should come as a relief to them because kids ask A LOT of questions. Fortunately, the opportunity to ask questions about God is not only for children, but it is for you and me as well.

As you prepare to teach this week, take a moment and allow yourself the opportunity to think like a child.
