Please read Psalm 145:1-6, Isaiah 6:1-7 then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Children's Worship the children will learn that God is glorious! Unfortunately, defining God's glory proves rather difficult because God is altogether other, and He exists in a category all of His own. We can attempt to define God's glory as "Interesting, special, or valuable," but nothing in our English language can accurately define God's glory. Although we may not be able to specifically define God's glory, we can look at the creation around us, God's handiwork, and find examples that point to God's glory.

Interestingly, the English definition of glory is known as "high renown or honor won by notable achievements." Take a moment to consider all of God's "notable achievements" that Scripture refers to throughout Biblical history. List some of them here:
