Read Psalm 103, then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Children's Worship, the kids are learning that God is actively involved in the world, and is attentive to the needs of His people. He sees, hears, and acts in the world for the good of His creation and according to His purposes. What a comfort it is knowing that God is always aware of the trials and temptations we face.

Psalm 103 is a beautiful depiction of the character of God in relation to His people.

- How does David describe God in verses 8-12? What attributes does He use?

Verses 13-18 remind us of the Lord's incredible compassion toward those who fear Him. It is also a reminder that God is aware of all our limitations.

- How does David describe our limited abilities in verses 13-18? What does he compare us to?
- What specific limitations, weaknesses, fears, or struggles are you facing right now?
- I love what Matthew 5:3 (MSG) says in regard to our limited abilities: "You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you, there is more of God and His rule." How might this verse alongside Psalm 103 be a source of comfort to you when you are faced with a trying circumstance or what feels like an impossible task?

Father, thank you for being aware of the limitations of your people. Please help us to turn to you and seek your help when it feels like our weakness is too much to bear. Help us to still praise you during difficult seasons and find comfort in knowing that you are aware of all we face.
