

God Our Provider

Read Philippians 4:10-20 and Acts 17:25, then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Children's Worship, the kids will learn that God is our Provider and will always meet our needs. Scripture tells us how God provided clothes for Adam and Eve, housing for Noah and his family, and food for the Israelites wandering in the wilderness. The God we serve is intimately involved in the struggles we face, and He wants us to come to Him with *all* of our needs, despite how big or small the need may feel. We can trust that He hears our cries and will not turn away from our pleas.

Part of this week's lesson involves making a list of examples including "everything" God has provided based off of Acts 17:25b. What a perfect way to remind ourselves of all that God has sovereignly done for us!

- Take a moment to make a list of how God has provided (big and small) this past week:
