

At the Throne of God

Read Revelation 7:9-17, then briefly consider the questions below.

This week in Sunday School, the kids are learning that God is faithful and keeps his promises. Our passage this week offers a glimpse into the future hope we have in Christ Jesus. As believers, we know this world is not our final home, rather we can look forward to the day when we will stand together praising Jesus. We long for the day when all pain and hardship will be gone, and in its place we can find rest in the presence of God.

Verse 14 tells us that our once dirty robes stained with sin have been made new because of Jesus!

- Take a moment to read the following verses. What do these verses have in common with Revelation 7:14?
 - 2 Corinthians 5:17:
 - Galatians 2:20:
 - Titus 3:5:

Our passage this week paints a beautiful picture of the scene we will one day encounter.

- Take a moment to closely read verses 9-10 noting the amount of detail throughout the passage:
 - Who is a part of this “great multitude”?
 - Where are they standing?
 - What are they wearing?
 - What are they saying?
- How does the detail in this passage give you a greater sense of anticipation for this day?

Revelation 7:15-16 tells us for those who sit “before the throne of God” will be “sheltered” by his presence. They will never again be hungry or thirst.

- What does it mean to be “sheltered” by God’s presence?
- How can we experience this shelter right now?

Father, we long for the day when we can stand before your throne praising you for all you have done. Thank you for being the faithful One and remaining true to the promises you’ve given. This

world is full of pain, and we look forward to the day when we can rest in your presence. Help us to persevere and trust in your goodness until then.
