

Bunker Hill

North Branch of the Chicago River

Address or Nearest Intersection:

N. Caldwell Ave. and N. Tonty Ave., Chicago, IL, or W. Devon Ave. just east of Milwaukee Ave., Chicago, IL (via the Caldwell Woods entrance).

Directions: Enter Bunker Hill Forest Preserve off of Caldwell Ave., south of the Touhy Ave. and north of Devon Ave. Once in the Bunker Hill forest preserve, take the drive to the first parking lot on your left (by Grove 1).

Continue to the southern end of parking lot. Walk the path down to river (there will be a bridge at the river).

Alternate access is at Caldwell Woods on the north side of Devon Ave. just east of Milwaukee Ave. If you access via Caldwell Woods just park and walk the bike trail to the north side of the preserve (until you get to the bridge).

Owner: Forest Preserves of Cook County (permit required).

Habitat Description: Bunker Hill is an oak savanna and woodlands with lots of open turfgrass for games.

Access to water: Good access to the east of the bridge on the north side of the river just south of Grove 1. Grove 4 also has great river access west of the shelter.

Amenities: Toilets available seasonally. Shelters for eating are available.

Parking: Large parking lots are available for cars and buses.

Capacity: 60 students.
