

Following is the suggested seed mix for the re-vegetation of gullies in Kickapoo Woods (FPCC) in Harvey, Illinois. These seeds would be mixed and spread over the newly exposed soil of the gully, prior to the installation of the erosion control blanket. The provenance of all species is within the Chicago Lakeplain of Illinois or sand districts of NW Indiana. Quantity of seed should be determined by a professional on a site-by-site basis.
